Almost devil-like horns top the newest of German high-speed trains, the "05001," which is one of the fastest steam-propelled trains in the world. When delivered to the German National Railroad Company, the 05001 attained a speed of 119.1 miles an hour on forced runs and averaged 105.6 miles an hour on its usual runs, while hauling five express coaches weighing 250 tons.
