
FRONT PAGE NEWS

THE SCENE was Pittsburgh on a September day in the year 1868. There was a wild clatter of horses' hoofs, the banging and scraping of wagon




wheels, the terrifying roar of an approaching train, and the piercing screech of a locomotive whistle.
