Science Talent Search Winners

► THE 40 WINNERS of the 23rd annual Science Talent Search have been announced by SCIENCE SERVICE. The most promising student-scientists among the nation's high school seniors were chosen from 3,141 completely qualified entrants, and were judged best among the Honors Group of 314.

The winners, 10 girls and 30 boys, have been invited to Washington to attend the Science Talent Institute, a five-day, all-expenses-paid session, Feb. 26 through March 2. During the Institute they will be judged for \$34,250 in Westinghouse Science Scholarships and Awards in the final phase of the Science Talent Search conducted by Science Clubs of America, an activity of SCIENCE SERVICE.

The winners come from 38 schools in 36 communities in 17 states. Among the winners, Nevada is represented for the first time.

Thirty-one of the 40 rank in the top five percent of their graduating classes, which range in size from 70 to 2,052. With the school year only half over, 14 of the 40 are already ranked first, second or third in their classes.

Two schools have more than one winner this year. They both are in New York: Forest Hills High School, Forest Hills, and Erasmus Hall High School, in Brooklyn, with two winners each.

Seventeen of the 38 schools in this year's Search have placed winners in previous years.

Grand totals for the schools placing additional winners this year show the Bronx High School of Science at the top of the list with 30 winners in the 23 years of the Science Talent Search, with Erasmus Hall High School in second place with 28. Stuyvesant High School, New York, and Forest Hills High School tie for third with 23 winners each over the years. Abraham Lincoln High School in Brooklyn, N. Y., is next with nine winners.

Tied with eight winners each are North Phoenix High School, Phoenix, Ariz., and Phillips Exeter Academy, Exeter, N. H. Six winners are credited to Jamaica (N. Y.) High School.

Both Taylor Allderdice High School in Pittsburgh and Wakefield High School, Arlington, Va., have had four winners.

Three winners have been claimed by Abraham Lincoln High School, San Francisco; Far Rockaway (N. Y.) High School and Martin Van Buren High School in Queens Village, N. Y.

Those schools placing winners for the second time are Bethesda-Chevy Chase High School, Bethesda, Md.; Montgomery Blair High School, Silver Spring, Md.; Las Cruces (N. Mex.) High School and New Dorp High School in Staten Island, N. Y.
