Doctors Are Reading

Hormone Lowers Fat Levels

➤ HIGH FAT LEVELS in the blood of "coronary-prone" persons can be abolished by injection of ACTH, or corticotropin, one of the hormones of the pituitary gland, before meals.

Reporting in the Journal of the American Medical Association, 190:959, 1964, Drs. Meyer Friedman, Sanford O. Byers and Ray H. Rosenman of San Francisco said they also had tried injecting ACTH into patients with Addison's disease, but that their fat levels were unchanged. Addison's disease is a serious ailment caused by abnormal functioning of the adrenal glands.

Blood samples were obtained after a 13-hour fasting period, and 15 hours after drug injection. A test meal was then given consisting of two eggs fried in butter, four strips of bacon, two slices of buttered toast, 750 milligrams of whole milk and 250 milligrams of cream.

The single administration of 80 units of ACTH alone lowered the fat levels just as drastically as did the combined dosage of ACTH with hydrocortisone. The researchers said additional investigation would be needed.

Arteries Transposed in Siblings

A rare case in which both an infant brother and sister had the aorta and pulmonary artery transposed was reported in JAMA, 190:969, 1964.

The girl, who lived 19 months, died unexpectedly while waiting

for a heart operation. The boy lived only two weeks. Autopsy showed that the two hearts were similar in most respects.

Genetic factors in congenital heart disease are not well understood, and studies on all the other members of this family who live in Omaha, Neb., have been unsuccessful in tracing these factors.

Drs. H. T. Lynch, R. L. Grissom and P. Mooring, with A. Krush, all of the University of Nebraska College of Medicine, reported the study. They said medical genetic literature reveals only one other autopsy confirmation of the transportation of the great vessels in siblings.

Disappearing Bones Explained

Cases in 12 different countries have been reported in which one or more bones seem to vanish completely or partially melt away. The condition usually affects children or young adults and rarely results in death.

An editorial in JAMA, 190:1005, 1964, calls attention to a report in the Archives of Pathology, 78:673, 1964, supporting the theory that the condition is promoted by a decrease in local circulation.

Dr. L. Whittington Gorham of the New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center, New York, and Dr. William T. West of New York State University, Downstate Medical Center, Brooklyn, experimented with mice to show bone reactions and accompanying circulation changes.
