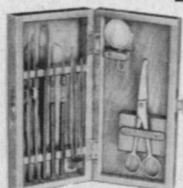

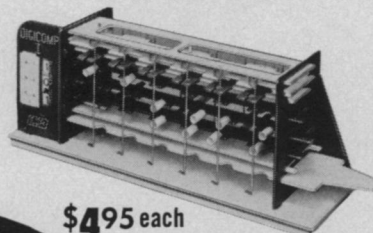

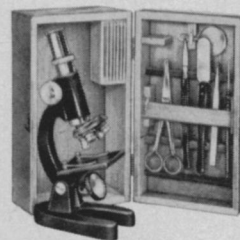

Here is a delightful book that shows you—and your youngsters—how to take castoffs, scrap materials, things you just haven't gotten around to throwing out, and to turn them into wonderful gifts, useful household items, and entertaining games. Not just a slim volume of uninspired ideas, this book is virtually an encyclopedia of low-cost, easily practiced handicrafts, written with sensitivity to a child's interests and with great imagination.

Over 200 "how-to" diagrams!

That's what makes this such a special book. Instead of just coming up with a few haphazard ways for disposing of scrap material, it presents nearly 400 constructive, well thought out amusements and diversions. 214 of these projects are illustrated with clear,

labeled how-to diagrams. Anyone who can fold a piece of paper can follow these sketches and the texts that go with them and make a surprising number and variety of things out of bric-a-brac you may have thought had outlived its usefulness.

A giant collection . . . over 350 pages of ideas!

Boxes, tin cans, crayons, clothespins, paper clips, old combs, rubberbands, pieces of ribbon, string, newspapers, etc. become, under Mrs. Hershoff's skillful direction, place mats, sun hats, aprons, airplanes, party favors, belts, Pilgrim hats, doll beds, book marks, scooters, animal cages, telephone sets, jewelry, lampshades, linoleum block prints, boats, pot

holders, stuffed toys, finger puppets, trucks, shoes, greeting cards, and dozens of other items.

There is no end of activity that can be organized around the ideas in this book. The author, a handicrafts instructor with a lot of school experience, firmly believes in using time, not wasting it. Thus her book is edifying and productive as well as fun, and it can be used by youngsters on their own for learning valuable lessons of resourcefulness and creativity. Anyone in charge of children, whether for days or weeks at a time, will recognize the enormous value of a comprehensive book of this kind, and will reap its benefits.
