

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# Doctors Are Reading

### Natural Cancer Study Needed

➤ GREATER CONCENTRATION on study of natural cancer in animals would perhaps have more effect than the presently emphasized methods of inducing cancer artificially, Dr. Albert B. Sabin, developer of the first live-virus polio vaccine, said in Medical World News, 6:73, 1965. Cattle lymphoma is one type of cancer that occurs naturally.

Dr. Sabin, professor of research pediatrics at the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine, Cincinnati, Ohio, said the injection of cancer into laboratory animals presents "new factors that do not apply to the natural hosts of these cancers."

We have been misled to a large extent by the experimental data by which virologists have produced cancers with certain viruses in some newborn animals, he added, explaining that "we have no evidence that the same thing takes place in natural conditions."

He also said a different approach is needed to cultivate the virus that causes hepatitis, and dismissed the idea of a vaccine against the common cold.

### Millions of Children Suffer From Allergies

More than three and a half million children suffer with some form of allergic disease, a prominent pediatrician in New York said in Medical Times, May 1965.

"Over one million children under 15 years of age are afflicted with bronchial asthma," Dr. Vincent J. Fontana, director of pedi-

atrics, St. Vincent's Hospital and Medical Center of New York, said.

Many of the adult allergic population begin having symptoms during childhood, he pointed out. If allowed to persist, there is a definite tendency for allergic diseases to become more complex with time.

The pediatrician divided bronchial asthma into three main types: 1. The noninfective or "extrinsic"—inhalants, food or drugs are the allergens. 2. The infective or "intrinsic"—usually associated with bacterial or viral infection. 3. The mixed type—infectious elements plus inhalants and/or foods.

Treatment of symptoms by drugs or other methods, search for causes and alleviation of anxiety in both parents and child are among the practical suggestions Dr. Fontana gave.

#### **Dwarfing Affects Three Generations**

Six members of three generations of one family have been reported dwarfed, with stiff joints and other abnormalities. Two physicians of the Harvard Medical School and Massachusetts General Hospital, Boston, said in Archives of Internal Medicine, 115: 398, 1965, that such cases are rare in the North American literature.

The researchers, Drs. W. Tabb Moore and Daniel D. Federman, who worked under a grant from the National Institutes of Health, U.S. Public Health Service, said the "pedigree suggests an autosomal dominant pattern of inheritance."
