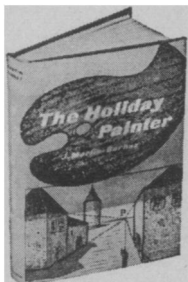

MOSSBAUER EFFECT METHODOLOGY, Vol. 1—Irwin J. Gruverman, Ed.—Plenum Press, 200 p., illus., \$12.50. Records the proceedings of the First Symposium devoted to principles, techniques and applications of the Mossbauer effect, held in New York City in 1965.

THE NATURE OF CANCER—P. M. Sutton—Crowell, 159 p., diagrams, \$3.50. Summarizes recent findings on prevention, treatment and cure of cancer.
