## Space Monkey Study To Add Detailed Data

➤ BRAIN WAVES recorded five months ago for more than 50 hours during Astronaut Frank Borman's Gemini 7 flight may not be fully understood until a macaque monkey makes a similar flight early in 1967 to provide more data.

Substantially more comprehensive instrumentation, not feasible for use in man, can be placed in deep body structures of the monkey, before it is launched from Cape Kennedy as part of the biosatellite program. Data on the effects of prolonged space. on the effects of prolonged space flight in an animal trained to perform tests of perception, recent memory and hand-eye coordination would be of use in later manned flights.

Tape recordings from the study on Astronaut Borman were submitted to extensive computer analysis. They clearly revealed drifting of consciousness toward drowsy states and showed

the patterns of sleep.

Dr. W. R. Adey and his team at the Brain Research Institute, University of California, Los Angeles, collaborated on the Borman study with Drs. P. M. Kellaway and R. Maulsby of the Methodist Hospital, Houston, Texas.

Two pairs of recording electrodes were secured to shaved areas of the scalp on the rear half of the astronous head. naut's head. Analysis of flight records began 15 minutes before launch and indicated an increasing "arousal reaction" up to and following launch, lasting for about 40 minutes. There was persistent orienting reaction to the novel and potentially hazardous environment of space flight.

Actual sleep on the first "night"

Actual sleep on the first "night" in space was limited to a brief period of about half an hour with much time in a drowsy state. On the second "night" sleep began very rapidly after a brief drowsy period and descended rapidly to a deep state, followed by gradual lightening over the next 90 minutes in a typically normal cyclic fashion fashion.

Three such cycles ensued before the astronaut wakened. Further records relating to sleep and wakefulness would be of great value in assessing work cycles.

## Nature Note

**Bamboo: Giant Grass** 

➤ TALLEST of the grass family, the slender bamboo unfolds its graceful feathery leaves in tropical and subtropical climates throughout the world. Some hardy species exist in colder climates, and every continent except Europe can boast its own native species. South Asia is richest in variations of native bamboos, the Americas are second, while Africa has very few.

The bamboos are probably the fastest growing species of the higher plants. A combination of cell-division and cell-stretching all along a two-foot growing zone on the stem can produce as much as a foot of new stem a day. Some bamboos can grow over 100 feet in two or three months, whereas other trees may take more than several decades to grow as high.

The fragile-looking bamboo is actually one of the strongest woody materials for its weight. Strengthened by silica, the hollow stems are impervious to moisture, are more durable than wood of the same weight, and resist tearing 10 times as well as ordinary wood.

For many centuries the light-green and golden bamboo has proven indispensable to man for cooking and building huts and bridges.
