# **Beliefs Attract People**

> THE PSYCHOLOGICAL "chemistry" that attracts one person to another seems to be common attitudes.

According to two recent studies, an individual's attitudes on issues ranging from school integration to war and necking are far more important than his prestige in making him personally attractive to another. Beliefs are also more important than race or sex.

In the prestige study, Drs. Donn Byrne and William Griffitt of the University of Texas and Carole Golightly of the University of Portland in Oregon, found that occupational status had virtually no influence on attraction, at least on paper.

Thirty student subjects were given attitude scales filled out by a number of anonymous strangers, and asked to judge whether or not they would

like and enjoy working with these people. The students strongly leaned toward those who expressed beliefs similar to their own, while the stranger's occupation, whether janitor or physicist, apparently had no effect on likability.

Perhaps, wrote the experimenters in the Duke University Journal of Personality 34:434, 1966, the impact of similar and differing attitudes on attraction is "extremely pervasive" and more general than would be expected.

A separate study of race, sex and belief as factors in friendship came up with similar results. Drs. Richard H. Willis, Carole R. Smith and Lev Williams of Washington University, St. Louis, Mo., reported at a recent psychological conference that only in the deep South was race more important than beliefs when 307 whites and Negroes were asked whether or not they would accept the friendship of a number of people described to them.

For all others, similarity of beliefs on issues was most important. Race, however, came second, while sex was least important.

## Plastic Patches Replace Braces on Teeth

➤ A NEW METHOD of straightening teeth may cut down on the groans of unlucky teen-agers by replacing the old metal braces with plastic patches.

old metal braces with plastic patches. Comfortable, quickly installed and removed, not apt to result in extremely decayed teeth, and hardly noticeable while on, the patches seem to have nothing in common with the old braces except that they do straighten teeth.

Placed on the tooth's front only, the plastic panel is only 1/16 of an inch thick and slotted in front to accommodate a wire to straighten the teeth. A transparent adhesive holds the panel in place on each tooth.

The patches have survived up to 10-month trials in volunteer youngsters, but will not be in general use for another two years. The developers, engineers at the Newark College of Engineering, N.J., want to perfect them to hold up for at least six months (the time between fittings) under any conditions

# Handwritten Numbers Can Be Read by Machine

➤ THE HANDWRITTEN numbers on everything from checks to sales slips can be read by a machine just introduced.

A company using the new reader does not have to convert pencil-written or printed numerical data into punched card machine language before entering it into a computerized filing system. It is transmitted directly from source documents into the computer, saving time and money, and eliminating conversion errors.

Developed by International Business Machines Corporation, the machine has read more than 18.5 million handwritten numbers at IBM's World's Fair exhibit and in field tests with a number of companies.

The problem of identifying variations in handwritten numbers has been solved by IBM with a tiny "flying spot" of light only five one-thousandths of an inch in diameter.

Projected by the machine's optical sensing unit, the flying spot scans lines or fields of numbers on a business document. When it crosses any part of a handwritten or printed number, it spirals completely around the number before moving on. This technique is called "curve-following."
