ADVENTURES IN SPACE AND TIME: The Story of Relativity—Herbert Kondo—Holiday House, 93 p., illus. by George Solonevich. \$2.95. Clear explanation of motion, speed time, bending light and the laws of special and general relativity, for young people.

AMERICAN HANDBOOK OF PSYCHIATRY, Vol. 3—Silvano Arieti, Ed.—Basic Bks., 778 p., \$20. Brings together advances since 1959 in many branches of psychiatry, most notably in biochemical psychiatry, community psychiatry and conceptual psychiatry.

AN ANNOTATED BIBLIOGRAPHY OF MEXICAN FERNS—George Neville Jones—Univ. of Ill. Press, 297 p., \$5. Mexico has an estimated number of about 700 species of ferns in about 80 genera, as compared to only 335 listed species in 58 genera in all North America north of Mexico.

THE APPLE AND THE SPECTROSCOPE: Lectures on Poetry designed (in the main) for Science Students—T. R. Henn, foreword by Roy Lamson—Norton, 166 p., plates, \$4.50. 
