This year's yearbook explains the scientific and technical achievements that have helped solve problems of food-stuff handling and protection against pests and spoilage, as well as general quality control.

**RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN PARTICLE SYMMETRIES:** 1965 International School of Physics "Ettore Majorana," a CERN-MPI-NATO Advanced Study Institute—A. Zichichi—Academic Press, 460 p., diagrams \$10.50. Discusses such theoretical problems as CP non-invariance, relativistic formulation of unitary symmetry, SU<sub>2</sub>, as well as associated experimental problems.

**THE RISE AND FALL OF MAYA CIVILIZATION**—J. Eric S. Thompson—Univ. of Okla. Press, 2nd ed., 328 p., 32 plates, drawings, \$5.95. Enlarged edition incorporates some of the more recent additions to our knowledge of the Mayas based on findings of the last decade.

**RIVER POLLUTION, III: Control**—Louis Klein—Butterworth, 484 p., \$20. Expanded and updated (Aspects of River Pollution, 1956), this volume deals with the detection and measurement of river pollution, pollution of tidal and coastal waters, sewage disposal and treatment of industrial wastes, standards for rivers, sewage and industrial effluents.

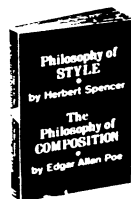
