Pocket guide for the identification of colors, explains basic color system facts and includes color dictionary of plates of 1,266 color samples accompanied by descriptive glossaries of color names.

In this Condon Lecture 1966, geologist discusses the geology of the moon, combining information from photographs of the lunar surface with data yielded by the most sophisticated modern physical measurements on the earth.

MOTOR FUELS: Performance and Testing—William A. Gruse—Reinhold, 280 p., \$12. Useful technical information on how fuels and lubricants work in the automotive engines of today, tells how to find out by testing whether a particular fuel or lubricant is suitable for the service required. required.

A VANISHING THUNDER: Extinct and Threatened American Birds—Adrien Stoutenburg—Natural Hist. Press, 124 p., illus. by John Schoenherr, \$3.50. Based on the records of naturalists, the book tells young people about the great auk, passenger pigeon and other disappearing species.

VIRUSES AND COLDS: The Modern Plague—John M. Adams—Am. Elsevier Pub. Co., 170 p., illus., \$5.75. Tells in layman's language what research has found out about the most common viral diseases affecting the respiratory passages

WONDERS OF THE MONKEY WORLD: Monkeys and Apes in the Wild—Jacquelyn Berrill—Dodd, 88 p., illus, by author, \$3. Tell young people about recent scientific observations in the tropical rain forests.


