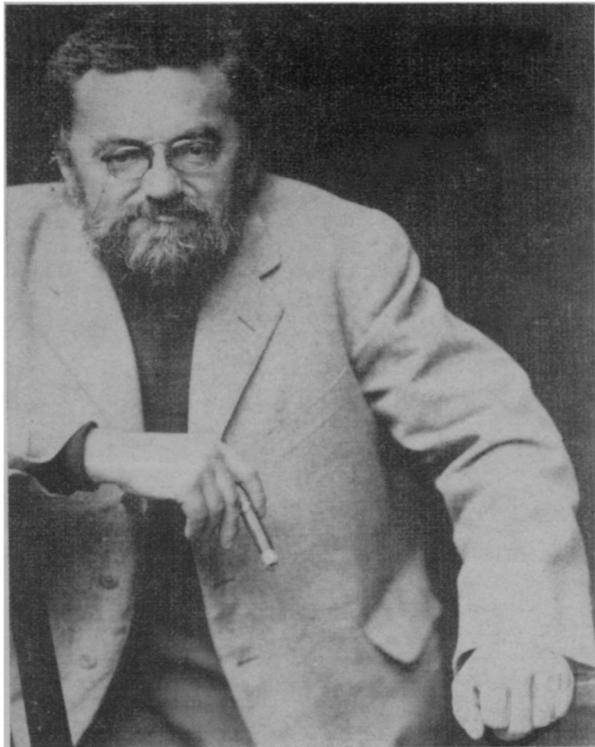


A major event in modern science, captured in . . .

Imagine being present when Huxley delivered his lectures on Darwinism . . . when Faraday spoke on the chemical history of a candle to the Royal Institute . . . when Lorentz lectured at the University of California! These were all great events, moments when a great mind was called upon to communicate its understanding, in simple terms, of a crucial topic of modern science.

Another great event—Steinmetz's lectures.

In 1922, one of the great mathematicians of the century (possibly of all time), Charles Proteus Steinmetz, lectured to the Pittsfield section of the AIEE on Einstein's relativity. At the time, the common saying was that only seven men in the world understood relativity, and Einstein wasn't one of them. Steinmetz, of course, was.

His non-technical lectures were an outstanding success. Steinmetz proved to be not only an original thinker of power and impact, but an expositor of great ability. Even today, his clear and precise explanations, his skillful use of non-technical analogies, and his straightforward language remain unique.

No matter what your own level of scientific understanding is, you will profit from this book. It is easily one of the most readable elementary accounts of the most important conceptual development in modern science that you are likely to find. As for more experienced readers, these verbal explanations of mathematical topics are invaluable for helping to reformulate your ideas in words.
