

## Antibiotic for Malaria

Your news item, "New Drug Against Malaria," (SN: 4/29) is a matter of some satisfaction to me because it has confirmed basically my work on the antibiotic effect of the natural pterine on the human malarial parasites, Plasmodium vivax. The results of this study were written in a paper, "Extracts of the wings of the Philippine butterfly, Terias hecabe Linn., a new antibiotic for malaria," which was published in the Journal of the Philippine MEDICAL ASSOCIATION, 1949, Vol. 25, No. 6, p. 279-290. This is listed in the Index Medicus.

In this paper, I used the natural pterine yellow pigment of the butterfly,



Terias hecabe Linn., in contrast to the acid compound derivative of pterine used by Dr. Roy L. Kisliuk and his associates at Tufts. I carried this study in both the vivax cultures and the clinical subjects.
