THE ATOM: YEAR OF PURPOSE. 16mm, color, sound, 29 min. Describes 17 major developments in the peaceful uses of the atom, as well as six spin-offs. The major stories include: first refueling of the nuclear ship Savannah in six years; the growth of nuclear power stations, experimental Breeder Reactor II, work on the giant 200 BEV atom smasher, Project Buggy and Project Gasbuggy (for the peaceful applications of nuclear explosives) for large-scale excavation and natural gas stimulation and the Phoebus-2A full-power ground test of nuclear-powered space rocket engine. MAPPING THE EARTH'S SURFACE. 16mm, color or b&w, sound, 16 min. A fascinating on-the-scene account made with the cooperation of the United States Geological Survey. Shows how maps are produced from accurate location of points on earth to printed reproduction. Students see how new measurements begin with an already established location point marked in metal, and how by triangulation methods, other points are determined. Audience: junior, senior high. THE SAFE HANDLING OF ENRICHED URANIUM. 16mm, color, sound, 22 min. Filmed primarily at the A. E. C.'s Y-12 Plant in Oak Ridge, Tenn., the motion picture introduces concepts of nuclear fission and criticality, and explains the reasons for safety procedures that are observed in the handling of enriched uranium and other fissionable materials. Contents include: an animated sequence which explains difference between U-238 and U-235; the concepts of nuclear fission and criticality; uses of enriched uranium; and scenes of persons working with U-235 in various forms (gas, powder, metal). Audience: new employees in nuclear production plants with or without technical background. 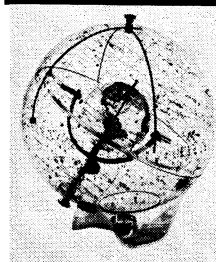
