ALTRUISM AND HELPING BEHAV-IOR: Social Psychological Studies of Some Antecedents and Consequences—J. Macaulay and L. Berkowitz, Eds.—Academic Press, 1970, 290 p., \$11.50. A program report on research in the area of human regard and concern for others, directed toward social psychologists, includes lab-oratory and field investigations, as well as naturalistic studies of altruism.

BIOLOGICAL CONSERVATION—David W. Ehrenfeld—Holt, 1970, 226 p., illus., paper, \$3.50. Scientifically valid presentamost relevant to the life of modern man, outlines the factors of ecology, and the impact of the population and technology explosions on the natural world within the context of western, urban society.

CHEMISTRY THROUGH THE LANGUAGE BARRIER: How to Scan Chemical Articles in Foreign Languages with Emphasis on Russian and Japanese—E. Emmet Reid—Johns Hopkins Press, 1970, 138 p., \$10.
