DIGGING UP THE PAST. 16mm, b&w, sound, 20 min. Begins with a brief description of the history of the world before man. Then it examines various artifacts early man left behind, which reveal a great deal about how he lived, hunted and protected himself from predators—both human and animal. We learn that the position in which objects are discovered in the ground is the key to determining their age. For example, those which are in the lowest level of the earth are the oldest. The message is gentle and humorous with fictional interviews on the rationale for smoking revealing the physical conditions of subjects to be at variance with the reasons given. To the American Indian portrayed in the film, the pipe no longer means peace, but profits and revenge as he watches 500 billion cigarettes going up annually in smoke, sending his tobacco stocks soaring. 
