Human scale in housing

Stockholm's Vällingby Center (SN: 11/6/71, p. 308), that urban planners' dream, was featured on a recent "60 Minutes" program on CBS TV. It was interesting to note that the inhabitants of the center who were interviewed all disliked their regimented, sterile, prison-like environment. As one woman put it, "the people who designed this place don't live here, they live elsewhere in their own private cottages."

It is natural for people to want a piece of ground they can call their own, and it is natural for people to want to fix up their homes to suit their own personalities, instead of having virtually everything planned for them. People are not cattle.

I deplore urban sprawl, especially here in the Denver area where the "developers" are raping the beautiful foothills to the west. But it is also obvious that highdensity, rental-type housing sooner or later leads to the worst kinds of problems.

The answer lies not in elimination of private home ownership or of single-family dwellings, but in wise and strict zoning, building codes that guarantee quality structures, preservation of large areas of unspoiled land that still exist through public ownership, encouragement of migration to rural towns that have lost population or could accommodate more people, and wise family planning so that more and more housing won't always be needed.

Protect the environment, but also protect people's right to be free human beings. John G. Pousma Denver, Colo.
