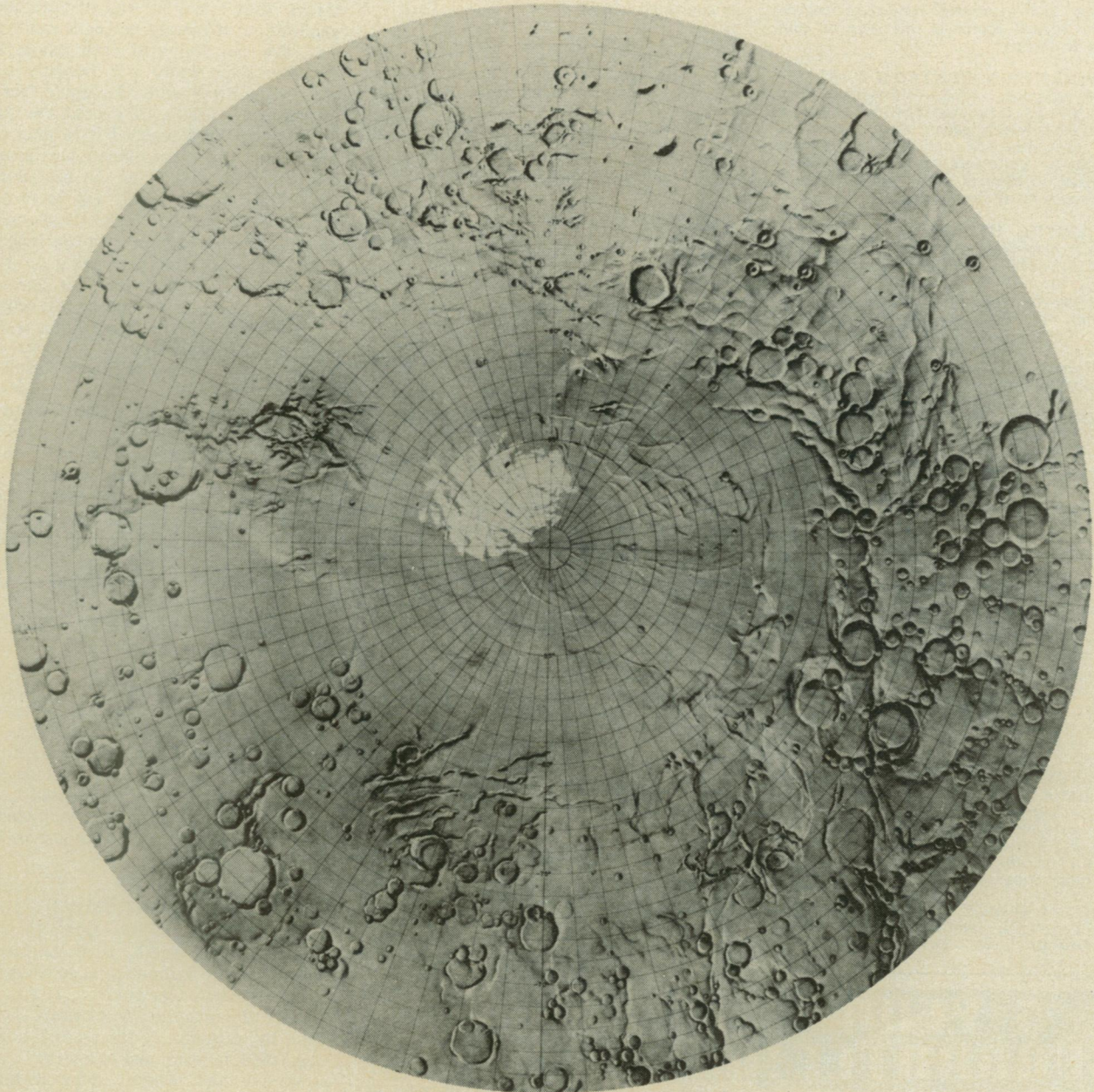

First polar projection map of the planet

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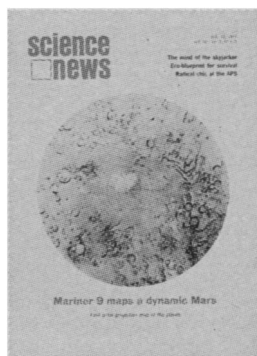
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Photos taken by Mariner 9 since the dust storm on Mars cleared show large volcanoes and features that could be construed as the result of erosion by water and glaciers. Mars seems to be a dynamic and even more interesting planet than before. See p. 106. (Stereographic projection of south polar region is based on Mariner 9 data as of Jan. 20 and is in a highly preliminary state. Map extends out to 65 degrees latitude. 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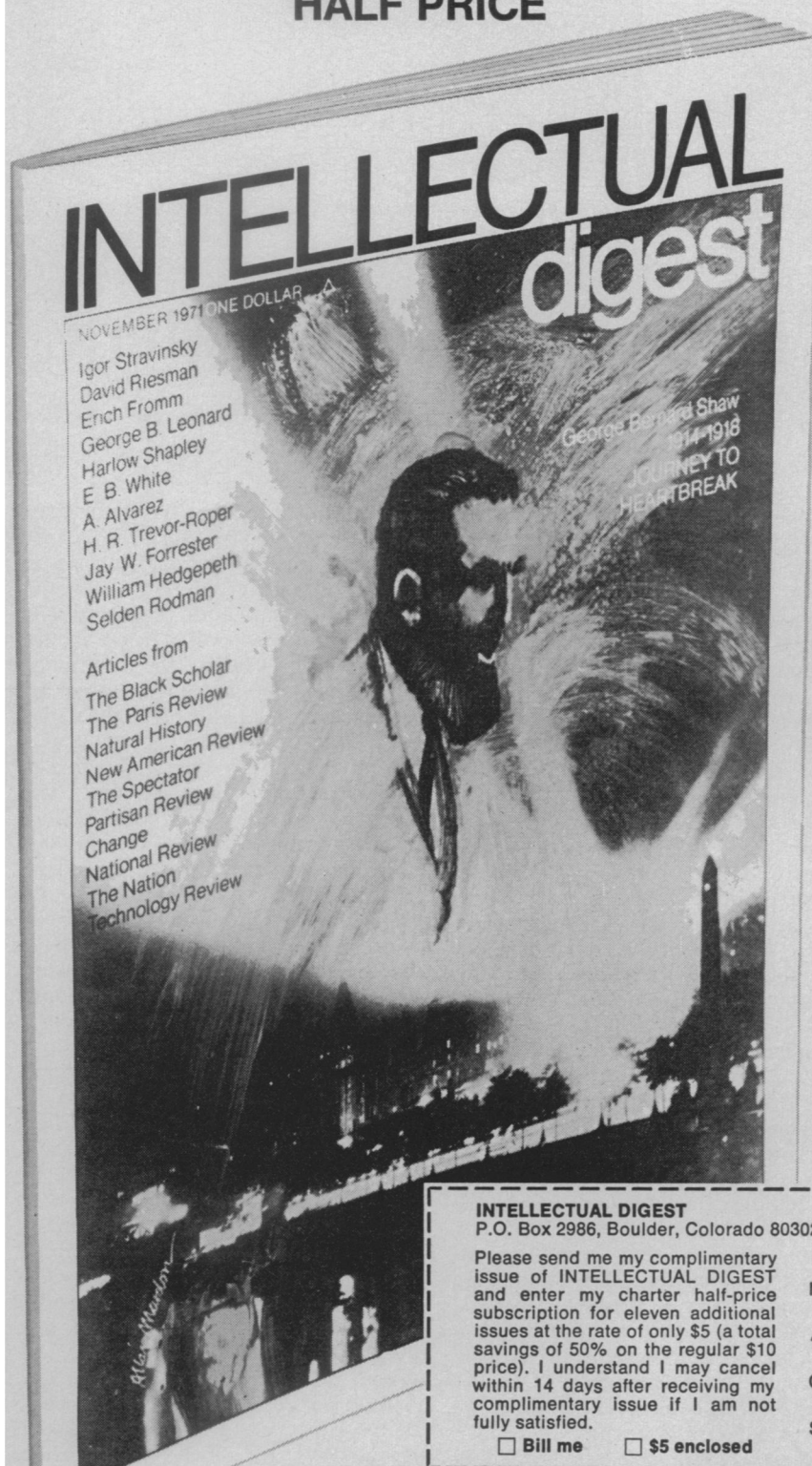
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
