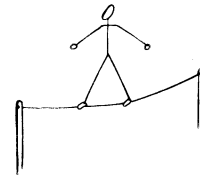
SUMMER PASTIME FOR ACTIVE CHILDREN

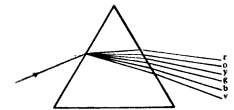

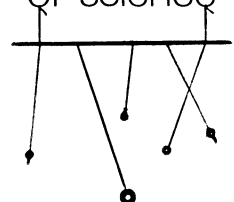

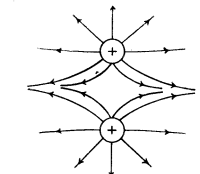
