CONFINED SPACE HAZARDS. 16mm, color, sound, 15 min. Safety procedures to be followed by men who must work in the confined spaces of tanks, boilers, hoppers, sewers, etc., are demonstrated in live-action sequences. Portraying both dangerously unsafe actions and safe procedures, the film shows the responsibility of the worker, a lookout man, a lifeline man, a back-up man with rescue apparatus and the supervisor. The narration details each step in checking and double-checking for conditions which could result in falls, vapor inhalation, explosions, electrocution, or injury from tools. Emphasis is placed on recognizing the hazardous space, planning for every eventuality, and precision in procedures. There are just enough frightening sequences to motivate attention and sufficient repetition to ensure comprehension. Audience: industrial workers. THE KIRTLAND'S WARBLER. 16mm, color, sound, 10 min. Relates the life history of the rare Kirtland's warbler, and shows management efforts to create habitat by planting jack pines and also by burning specific areas to allow natural jack pine growth. It also shows the efforts to control nest parasitism by cowbirds, which are probably the greatest threat to the Kirtland's warblers survival. Because of the drastic population drop in 1961 to 1971, the birds are counted each year now. Cooperative efforts of several agencies help provide suitable jack pine nesting habitat for the warblers. Though these pines extend across much of the continent, the birds seem to be limited to the area in Michigan where sandy porous soil is found. Audience: high school, college, general. The density of a solid is a conveniently measurable property which is useful as a means of following physical changes in a sample, as an indication of uniformity among samples, and as a means of identification. 
