BODY CONSCIOUSNESS: You Are What You Feel—Seymour Fisher—P-H, 1973, 176 p., \$5.95; paper, \$2.45. Since what we perceive, think and believe occurs in the context of our body experiences, psychologist here gives an overview of where we stand in our understanding of the body as a personal, psychological event.

THE COMPLETE ILLUSTRATED BOOK OF BETTER HEALTH—Richard J. Wagon, M.D., Ed., and J. G. Ferguson Editorial Staff, N. Henry Moss, M. D., Consult. Ed.—Ferguson, J. G. (Doubleday), 1973, 767 p., color plates, photographs, drawings, \$17.95. A team of medical specialists summarizes in plain language currently preferred methods of preventing, diagnosing and treating disease, and traces normal physical development through all stages of life.

COMPUTERS IN ARCHITECTURAL PRACTICE—Bryan Guttridge and Jonathan R. Wainwright—Halsted Pr, 1973, 121 p., diagrams, charts, \$7.75. After investigating the work being carried out by architectural practice, the study seeks to assess the feasibility of computer applications in this field.

ENCOUNTER GROUPS: First Facts—Morton A. Lieberman, Irvin D. Yalom and Matthew B. Miles—Basic Bks, 1973, 495 p., diagrams, tables, \$15. Scientific study of the encounter movement surveys current theories

for changing people in groups, and examines 17 different types of encounter groups, comparing and assessing outcomes for participants.

GAMMA-RAY SPECTROSCOPY with Particular Reference to Detector and Computer Evaluation Techniques—P. Quittner—Halsted Pr, 1973, 112 p., diagrams, \$13.95. Treats in detail the main features of gamma spectra, spectrum generation, peak location, peak area calculation, weighted least-squares resolution, and discusses experimental errors.

HEADACHES: The Kinds and the Cures—Arthur S. Freese, D.D.S.; preface by David R. Coddon, M.D.—Doubleday, 1973, 182 p., \$6.95. Clearly written, encyclopedic reference book on all aspects of face, head and neck pains. Bibliography and detailed index included.

ILLNESS, IMMUNITY AND SOCIAL INTERACTION: The Dynamics of Biosocial Resonance—Gordon Ervin Moss—Wiley, 1973, 281 p., \$14.95. Presents a broad theoretical framework linking social behavior and disease, conceptualizing the relation between social participation, physiological processes, and disease susceptibility.

KENTUCKY BIRDS: A Finding Guide—Roger W. Barbour and others—U Pr of Ky, 1973, 306 p., 239 color photographs, maps, \$9.75. Contains description of every one of the 321 species that has been reliably recorded within the state. Identifies 47 types of habitats which offer good opportunities for bird watchers.

LIFE'S BASIS: Biomolecules—Gary E. Parker and Thomas R. Mertens—Wiley, 1973, 158 p., illus., paper, \$2.95. A self-teaching guide, programmed to explain biomolecular structure, the roles in life of DNA and proteins, and the relationship between these and other biomolecules in the context of living cells.

METEOROLOGICAL GLOSSARY—D. H. McIntosh—Chem Pub Co., 1972, 319 p., 28 plates, \$15. Enlarged 5th edition revised in cooperation with the Meteorological Office.

ORGANOGENESIS OF FLOWERS: A Photographic Text-Atlas—Rolf Sattler—U of Toronto Pr, 1973, 230 p., 1200 photographs, diagrams, \$27.50. Describes the patterns of floral development in 50 selected species using the author's dissection technique of floral buds depicted in three-dimensional photography, showing a key phenomenon responsible for diversity in organic growth, namely differential growth.

THE RADIO AMATEUR'S HANDBOOK 1973—Headquarters Staff, ARRL—Am Radio Relay League, 50th ed., 704 p., illus., \$7.50; paper, \$4.50. Standard manual extensively revised.

RELATIVITY AND COSMOLOGY—William J. Kaufmann, III—Harper, 1973, 134 p., photographs, diagrams, paper, \$2.95. Designed for the lay public, the book focuses on the results of newly gained insights in astronomy and astrophysics, and the relevancy of the general theory of relativity to any in-depth understanding of physical reality.

RUSSIAN AGRICULTURE: A Geographic Survey—Leslie Symons—Wiley, 1973, 360 p., maps, tables, \$13.50. After examining the impact of climate and the variation of soil resources, the survey turns to a systematic study of the work force, grain farming, industrial crops, the livestock industry, specialization and conservation in the U.S.S.R.

SAILING SOLO TO AMERICA—Frank Page—Quadrangle Bks., 1973, 109 p., photographs, \$10. Gives an account of the four Singlehanded Transatlantic Races held since 1960; discusses rules, specifications, boats and competitors.

SUBCELLULAR COMPONENTS: Preparation and Fractionation—G. D. Birnie, Ed.—Univ. Park, 1973, 2nd ed., 320 p., \$19.50. Contains new material on the use of zonal centrifugation showing that some subcellular fractions, formerly thought homogeneous, consist in fact of a mixture of components.

THIS LAND WAS THEIRS: A Study of the North American Indian—Wendell H. Oswalt—Wiley, 1973, 2nd ed., 617 p., 76 photographs, maps, \$13. Anthropologist's descriptive accounts of representative tribes, traced from their origins to present status, with introductory and concluding chapters giving overview and perspective.

TODAY AND TOMORROW—Isaac Asimov—Doubleday, 1973, 321 p., \$6.95. Collection of 32 updated science essays on such topics as biological clocks, asteroids, the nature of fire, lunar landings, speculations about future fun, and the serious side of science fiction.

A WALDEN TWO EXPERIMENT: The First Five Years of Twin Oaks Community—Kathleen Kinkade, foreword by B. F. Skinner—Morrow, 1973, 283 p., \$7.95. Describes life in an experimental community founded in 1967, attempting a practical test of B. F. Skinner's utopian community designed to function by applying the principles of behavior modification.

WHAT WE EAT TODAY: The Food Manipulators vs. the People—Michael and Sheilagh Crawford; foreword by Sir Frank Fraser Darling—Stein & Day, 1973, 192 p., plates, \$6.95. Biochemist-nutritionist team compare patterns of nutrition and disease in Africa and Europe, and view people and animals in a situation of possible progressive degradation.

WHO WAKES THE GROUNDHOG? Ronald Rood—Norton, 1973, 206 p., illus. by Carrye E. Schenk, \$6.95. Following the seasons, the author describes the ways of bugs, birds and beasts as according to their innate time-tables they populate their particular niches in nature.
