BEHAVIOR AND ECOLOGY OF VERVET MONKEYS. 16mm, color, sound, 40 min. Filmed in the Masai-Amboseli Game Reserve Filmed in the Masai-Amboseli Game Reserve of Kenya, this field study describes basic aspects of the behavior and ecology of freeranging vervet monkeys, including social structure, behavior patterns employed in social interactions, dominance, sexual behavior and mother-infant relations. Dr. Thomas T. Struhsaker of the New York Zoological Society and The Rockefeller University describes the general habitat and interspecific relations of this vervet population. EYE TO EYE WITH WILD ANIMALS. 16mm, color, sound, 21 min. The Budapest Zoo has conducted interesting and innovative experiments in animal growth and behavior involving the raising of animals from infancy by foster-parents of another species. These experiments have been recorded by the camera and edited into a film on animal behavior which puts the viewer "eye to eye" with wild animals. A brief, concise narration generalizes upon the substance of the filmed behavior, and extends its implications for the understanding of animal life both in and out of captivity. FIRST FRIENDS. 16mm, color, sound, 22 min. Shows how a child becomes part of a group. Set in a pre-school, youngsters play together and reveal a wide range of feelings, attitudes and behavior. Development is shown as related to changes of mind and body which lead to a sense of self-mastery and independence. Self-centered activity of the toddler is being replaced by social interaction—affection. aggressiveness. problem sharing. modeler is being replaced by social interaction—affection, aggressiveness, problem sharing. Both verbal and nonverbal communication are highlighted. By presenting both problem situations and cooperative behavior, the film raises many of the issues involved in handling expressions of emotion, different forms of activity, and varying levels of coping skills. It places the viewer in the position of having to grapple with when to intervene or when to allow the child to solve problems independently. GLOVE BOX FIRES. 16mm, color, sound, 25 min. Improvements, relating to fire safety, made to the plutonium processing facilities of the Rocky Flats Plant after and as a result of a major fire are shown. The fire properties of glove box construction materials and means for protecting high efficiency particulate air (HEPA) filters from the effects of fire in the glove box system are shown. The design of radiochemical processing buildings and interaction between the design and escape of particulate contamination are explained. Burning-rate tests of various construction materials installed on a full-scale glove box are presented, and results of tests of various sprays and mist eliminators are shown. These tests resulted in recommendations for materials and devices which are shown as installed. Audience: technical, professional.
