Describes what a robot spacecraft, planned for the late 1970's, might see on its voyage to the outer planets when these will be in the best orbital alignment.

BIRDS OF THE WORLD: Their Life and Habits—Paul Barruel, transl. from French; preface by Francois Bourlière—Oxford U Pr, 1973, rev. ed., 9x11, 222 p., color-plates, 310 photographs & drawings, \$25. Spectacularly illustrated, this updated introduction to bird biology deals with a wide variety of bird activities, flight patterns, habits of display, nesting, migration and habitat.
