LA JETEE. 16 mm, b&w, sound, 29 min. An English version of a classic French science fiction film, the story is about one of the survivors of World War III in Paris. He has a vivid childhood memory of a young woman at Orly Airport watching a man's sudden death. This image acts as a springboard which later enables him to project himself into the past to meet with the girl for progressively longer intervals. The scientists who supervise man's travels in time then insist that he journey into the future to find a means for their survival. After succeeding, he realizes that he is expendable and that the scientists plan to kill him. Although the men in the future invite him to stay, he decides to flee to the past and join the girl he has fallen in love with. One of the experimenters follows him to his mental retreat at the Orly Airport and fires a shot. LINE OF BALANCE. 16mm, color, sound, 14 min. Explains the principles and applications of the Line of Balance programming method for the planning and control of production. Although originally developed for the construction industry, the method is readily applied to any production process that involves repetitive or sequential operations. The program determines the resources and speed required for each stage of production to match a desired rate of output. It establishes the common rhythm of work for operations needed to keep production flowing smoothly, and it allows for slight variations by introducing a buffer between operations, usually a stock products or time. We see him at home, surrounded by his large family, carving a stone figure as he talks of the changes that modern technology and communications have brought to the lives of his people. Now they live in simple modern houses and drive snowmobiles. In his youth, they hunted seals and caribou and drove dogsleds. But they have always been carvers, first of bone and ivory, and now of stone. The plane which brings in supplies to their remote settlement takes out carvings and paintings as well as furs. 
