BARRIER ISLANDS—Maurice L. Schwartz, Ed. —Dowden-Hutchinson, 1973, 451 p., photographs, diagrams, maps, \$22. Collection of Benchmark Papers on the geology of barrier-lagoon coasts, from de Beaumont's discourse on sand banks (1844), to discussion of Australian barrier formations (1972).

BEGINNER'S GUIDE TO HYDROPONICS: Soilless Gardening—James Sholto Douglas—Drake, 1973, 156 p., illus., paper, \$2.95. Gives concise instructions about process, growing units, plant care, recommended crops, and miscellaneous uses.

CHEMICAL TECHNOLOGY: An Encyclopedic Treatment, Vol. VI: Wood, Paper, Textiles, Plastics and Photographic Materials—B&N, 1973, 686 p., photographs, diagrams, tables, \$42.50. Each chapter presents comprehensive and up-to-date account of the subject, written by specialist.

ECOLOGY OF TROPICAL AND SUBTROPICAL VEGETATION—Heinrich Walter, transl. from German by D. Mueller-Dombois; J. H. Burnett, Ed.—Van Nos Reinhold, 1973, 557 p., photographs, diagrams, maps, \$27.50. Study presents a major synthesis of information on the vegetation of tropical and subtropical zones throughout the world.

MARINE AQUARIUM KEEPING: The Science, Animals and Art—Stephen Spotte—Wiley, 1973, 171 p., 80 photographs, drawings, \$9.95. Clear and detailed information on how to maintain scientifically a wholesome chemistry in the highly unstable marine aquarium environment, which animals thrive, which don't, types of food, feeding techniques, and the art of display.

THE MODERN CONCEPT OF NATURE: Essays on Theoretical Biology and Evolution by H. J. Muller—Elof Axel Carlson, Ed.—State U of NY Pr, 1973, 272 p., photograph, \$8.95; paper, \$4.95. A broad, factual account of the subject, treats physical properties and types of sound, measurement of sound, mechanism of hearing and its measurement, deafness, temporary and permanent disturbances, aircraft and other intense noise.

THE TROPICAL FOREST: Ants, Ants, Animals and Plants—Mary Batten—T Y Crowell, 1973, 130 p., illus. by Betty Fraser, maps, \$4.95. Handsomely designed and informative book tells of the complex fauna and flora in the warm, moist forests that gird the earth, and of their fragile ecology that has only begun to be understood by teams of exploring biologists.





