CABLE TELEVISION: A Handbook for Decision-Making—Walter S. Baer—Crane-Russak, 1974, 244 p., illus., tables, \$11. Based on a Rand Corporation study, this comprehensive outline provides basic information about cable TV, presents the poltical, social, economic, legal and technical issues which have to be considered by local government and citizen groups.

CHEMISTRY AND THE TECHNOLOGICAL BACK-LASH—James L. Pyle—P-H, 1974, 368 p., photographs, diagrams, tables, \$11.95; paper, \$7.25. Intended as a resource and supplementary text, highlights the importance of chemistry in dealing with specific social problems, from energy resources, pollution, pesticides, and solid wastes, to contraceptives, food additives, and the chemistry of genetics.

DARWIN ON MAN: A Psychological Study of Scientific Creativity—Howard E. Gruber with Darwin's Early and Unpublished Notebooks, transcribed & annotated by Paul H. Barrett; foreword by Jean Piaget—Dutton, 1974, 495 p., illus., \$20. This major study of creativity aims to describe the growth of thought in a real, thinking, feeling, dreaming person. Includes the first transcriptions of Darwin's notebooks on man and the evolution of mind.


EDGE OF THE WORLD: Ross Island, Antarctica—Charles Neider—Doubleday, 1974, 478 p., 33 color plates by author, historical photographs, 14 maps, glossary, \$14.95. A personal and historical narrative of exploration, science, adventure, photographer's problems, crashes and rescues, adds up to a vivid portrait of conditions in the polar world.

STYLE MANUAL—U.S. Government Printing Office—GPO, 1973, rev. ed., 548 p., \$4.70; paper, \$2.95. Designed to standardize and achieve uniform word and type treatment in the preparation of manuscripts, includes extensive guides to compounding, and tabular work, as well as typography of the more important foreign languages.

THE TITANIC EFFECT: Planning for the Unthinkable—Kenneth E. F. Watt—Dutton, 1974, 268 p., tables, \$7.95. Carefully documented examination of the effects of unrestrained economic growth, explains causal relationships in such fields as energy, food, pollution, inflation, manpower, and suggests methods for taking action in time to prevent potential disasters.

TREASURE KEEPERS—John FitzMaurice Mills—Doubleday, 1974, 8x10, 160 p., color plates, photographs, \$7.95. Discusses techniques and shows examples of how museum art objects are investigated, restored after damage, and protected against deterioration.
