COMMUNICATION WITH EXTRATERRESTRIAL INTELLIGENCE (CETI)—Carl Sagan, Ed.—MIT Pr, 1973, 428 p., illus., \$10. Proceedings of an interdisciplinary conference of prominent scientists who met in the USSR to examine together the probability and the tools for finding out whether there are other equally or more intelligent beings in the universe. [A]

THE COSMIC CONNECTION: An Extraterrestrial Perspective—Carl Sagan, produced by Jerome Agel—Doubleday, 1973, 274 p., photographs, diagrams, \$7.95. Discusses with great style the intimate connection of earth life and stellar events. [B]

EARLY MAN: Prehistory and the Civilizations of the Ancient Near East—Chester G. Starr—Oxford U Pr, 1973, 206 p., color plates, photographs, maps, \$8.95; paper, \$3.50. Gives a selective overview of a million years of human history, abundantly illustrated, and based on the latest scholarly studies. [C]

EINSTEIN—Jeremy Bernstein—Viking Pr, 1973, 242 p., \$6.95. New study concentrates on the three basic themes in Einstein's work—the development and consequences of the special theory of relativity; the general theory of relativity and gravitation; and quantum theory. [D]

GALAXIES OF LIFE: The Human Aura in Acupuncture and Kirlian Photography—Stanley Krippner and Daniel Rubin, Eds.—Interface Bk (Gordon), 1973, 182 p., color plates, photographs, diagrams, \$12.50. Reports on current experimental research in the area of radiation-field photography. [E]

GREENHOUSE GARDENING—Henry T. Northen and Rebecca T. Northen—Ronald, 1973, 2nd ed., 338 p., color plates, photographs, drawings, \$9.50. Practical information on selecting, building, equipping and managing a greenhouse, and modern methods for growing familiar as well as exotic plants. [F]

HANDBOOK OF VITAMINS AND HORMONES—Roman J. Kutsky—Van Nos Reinhold, 1973, 278 p., \$14.95. Makes easily available unitary, basic information on the properties and modes of action of both the vitamins and the hormones, and on their interrelationships to each other as metabolic controlling agents. JUNG, SYNCHRONICITY & HUMAN DESTINY: Noncausal Dimensions of Human Experience—Ira Progoff—Julian, 1973, 176 p., \$6.50. Clarifies Jung's concepts of synchronicity, the I Ching and Tao, archetypes and the patterning of time, and the synchronistic ground of parapsychic events. [H] METRIC SYSTEM SIMPLIFIED—Gerald W. Kelly—Sterling, 1973, 80 p., illus., \$2.95. Ready-reference conversion tables and explanations with practical examples for the nonmathematically inclined reader. [1]

THE ORIGINS OF LIFE ON EARTH—Stanley L. Miller and Leslie E. Orgel—P-H, 1974, 239 p., photographs, diagrams, \$10.95; paper, \$5.95. Interdiciplinary treatment of the subject, attempts to reconstruct the chemical processes that occurred on the primitive earth and led to the appearance of the first living organisms. [J]

PICTORIAL ASTRONOMY—Dinsmore Alter, Clarence H. Cleminshaw and John G. Phillips—T Y Crowell, 1974, 4th ed., 328 p., color plates, 300 photographs and drawings, \$10. Latest revision of the popular astronomy book for amateurs, includes new developments in our understanding of planets, pulsars, neutron stars, black holes, quasars, the interstellar medium, and galactic structure. PROBABILITY—Donald J. Koosis—Wiley, 1973, 163 p., diagrams, paper, \$2.95. Programmed instruction to teach yourself the basic concepts and skills of probability, includes practice problems and self-tests at the end of each chapter. [L]

RELATIVITY AND COSMOLOGY—William J. Kaufmann, III—Har-Row, 1973, 134 p., photographs, diagrams, paper, \$2.95. Designed for the lay public, the book focuses on the results of insights in astronomy and astrophysics, and the relevancy of the general theory of relativity to any in-depth understanding of physical reality.
