Compendium of up-todate information, classification system follows Peters, Mayr & Greenway check list, includes comparative review of other systems

MANGANESE---Committee on Biological Effects of Atmospheric Pollutants—Div. of Medical Sciences, NRC—Nat Acad of Sci, 1974, 200 p., tables, paper, \$6.25. Document examines the effects of airborne managenese in particular, but also considers biologic intake from other routes.

MOLECULAR STRUCTURE AND FUNCTION OF FOOD CARBOHYDRATE-G. G. Birch and L. F. Green, Eds.-Wiley, 1974, 319 p. illus., \$32.50. Papers by international authorities cover all aspects of chemistry and the stereochemical basis of the technological, nutritional and metabolic properties of food carbohydrate.

ORBITAL INTERNATIONAL LABORATORY: Third and Fourth Oil Symposia—Ernst A. Steinhoff, Ed.—Am Astronautical Soc (UNIVELT), 1974, 320 p., illus., \$20. Symposia deal with management of international space stations, results from Soyuz 9, TV broadcasting from satellites, global sensing from space, and monitoring.

PLASTICS IN CONTACT WITH FOOD-John H. Briston and Leonard L. Katan—Food Trade Pr (Avi), 1974, 478 p., diagrams, \$45. Discusses technology of thermoplastics, nonplastics components, food quality and health, toxic hazards, organoleptic effects, U.S. and European laws and regulations. Then deals with the many ways in which plastics raw materials are transformed into food-packaging materials.

THE SEAS AND OCEANS IN COLOR-C. F. Hickling and Peter Lancaster Brown—Mac-millan, 1974, 260 p., color plates, diagrams, index, \$5.95. Compact handbook of information about the hydrosphere, its physiology and geology, drift, distribution of sea water and currents, fishing, sonar probes, and underwater oil extraction.

THE SOCIAL BEHAVIOR OF THE BEES: A Comparative Study—Charles D. Michener—Belknap (Harvard U Pr), 1974, 404 p., photographs, drawings, \$25. Concerned with the distinctively social attributes of the bees, the origin and evolution of social behavior in the entire superfamily Apoidea. No attention is given to practical aspects of bee management.
