ASIMOV ON CHEMISTRY—Isaac Asimov—Doubleday, 1974, 267 p., photographs, \$8.95. Articles deal with inorganic, nuclear and organic chemistry, biochemistry and geochemistry, plus article on Nobelists in science.

BRONZE AGE MIGRATIONS IN THE AEGEAN: Archaeological and Linguistic Problems in Greek Prehistory—R. A. Crossland and Ann Birchall, Eds.—Noyes Pr, 1974, 387 p., 33 plates, maps, \$30. Presents the main current theories about the prehistoric formation of the Greek people and the Greek language, reports on new excavations on Thera, and discoveries in Albania and Yugoslavia.

FLOWERING PLANTS: Evolution Above the Species Level—G. Ledyard Stebbins—Belknap/Harvard U Pr, 1974, 417 p., illus., \$18.50. This important study reexamines the evolutionary history of flowering plants, interpreting their phylogeny in the light of modern knowledge about genetics, developmental biology and ecology.

FOR ALL MANKIND: America's Space Programs of the 1970s and Beyond—L. B. Taylor, Jr., foreword by Wernher von Braun—Dutton, 1974, 320 p., photographs, \$8.95. Describes the cultural and economic benefits from communication and earth-sensing satellites, as well as from practical applications of inventions for space use.

GEMS AND MINERALS IN COLOR—Rudolf Metz, transl. from German by G. A. Wells—Hippocrene Bks, 1974, 255 p., 150 color photographs by A. E. Fanck, \$6.95. Pocketsize handbook for the mineral collector with color plates of outstanding quality.

LIFE AT THE SEA'S FRONTIERS—Richard Perry —Taplinger, 301 p., drawings by Nancy Lou Gahan, \$7.95. Citing observations and original research, naturalist gives a highly informative account of the changing ecological balance of plants and animals living in reefs, atolls, mangrove swamps and mudflats.

McGRAW-HILL ENCYCLOPEDIA OF ENVIRON-MENTAL SCIENCE—Daniel N. Lapedes, Ed.-in-Chief—McGraw, 1974, 754 p., photographs, diagrams, \$24.50. A comprehensive reference volume, covers environmental aspects in such diverse fields as meteorology, climatology, plant and animal ecology, oceanography, soil engineering and many more.

NATURE'S COLORS: Dyes from Plants—Ida Grae—Macmillan, 1974, 239 p., color plates, b&w photographs, drawings, \$14.95. A thorough and practical guide to dyeing in the home kitchen, with recipes for 268 colors from plants in different parts of the U.S., researched, tested and evaluated.

OBESE HUMANS AND RATS—Stanley Schachter and Judith Rodin—LEA Pubs (Halsted Pr), 1974, 192 p., diagrams, tables, \$10.95. Examines the behavioral similarities of obese humans and animals whose so-called feeding center (the ventro-medial hypothalamic nuclei) has been lesioned.

Social science inquiries into the consequences of facial disfigurement and the reconstruction of the impaired countenance.

ULTRASONIC COMMUICATION BY ANIMALS—Gillian Sales and David Pye—Halsted Pr, 1974, 292 p., 14 plates, diagrams, tables, \$15.75. Draws together all the known examples of animal communication by ultrasound, covering studies with bats, insects, rodents and other vertebrate groups.

THE UTAH UFO DISPLAY: A Biologist's Report—Frank B. Salisbury, with data from the files of Joseph Junior Hicks; foreword by J. Allen Hynek—Devin-Adair, 1974, 310 p., plates, maps, tables, \$7.95. their natural habitats with commentary on the birds and their habits.

WOMEN OF THE FOREST—Yolanda Murphy and Robert F. Murphy—Columbia U Pr, 1974, 250 p., \$10; paper, \$3.45. Anthropological study based on field work in two villages of Amazonian Brazil, aimed at analyzing the sex relations among Mundurucú Indians from the standpoint of the female.

WOMEN, WORK AND VOLUNTEERING—Herta Loeser—Beacon Pr, 1974, 254 p., illus. by Inge Pavlowsky, \$8.95. Thoroughly researched practical aid to women in cities and suburbs, intended to help them choose and get started in a wide variety of volunteer jobs.

ZOO: Animals, People, Places—Bernard Livingston—Arbor Hse, 1974, 290 p., photographs, \$8.95. Narrative describes the world of the zoo, from ancient to typical to special zoos, animal traders, breeding in zoos, animal superstars, and future zoo plans.
