Among other topics covers the evolution of weeds, ecology of mangroves, historical biogeography, stream drift, evolution of social behavior, and demography of plants.

ASTROPHYSICS OF GASEOUS NEBULAE-Donald E. Osterbrock—W. H. Freeman, 1974, 266 p., photographs, diagrams, tables, glossary, \$17. Graduate text and reference for research workers, presents the basic theory of the gaseous nebula, using both observational and thoretical results as illustrations.

BEHAVIOR AS AN ECOLOGICAL FACTOR—David E. Davis, Ed.—DH&R, 1974, 405 p., illus., tables, \$24. Compendium of landmark papers which have significantly influenced the study of animal behavior as it relates to the environment. Traces the development of this subject from the narrow focus on the organism to studies of the behavior of entire populations.

THE BIOLOGY OF CANCER—Armin C. Braun Addison-Wesley, 1974, 180 p., illus., \$9.50; paper, \$4.50. Identifies the essential biological concepts that underlie the tumorous state of cells, the development of autonomy in plant and animal cells, somatic mutation, oncogenic viruses, epigenetic changes, and biologic approaches to control.

CAVES-Tony Waltham-Crown, 1974, 240 p., 200 color and b&w photographs, drawings, maps, \$12.50. A grand tour of the earth's caves, exploring that strange subterranean world of passages and caverns, rock formations, biological adaptations to cave life, and marks of early man. Discusses the hydrology of caves, the pattern of underground water flow.
