Explores the relationship between various types of reproduction and the evolutionary process, and proposes minimal modifications of the current evolutionary theory in order to account for the persistence of the seemingly maladaptive character of sexual reproduction in higher plants and animals.

SHARK SAFARI—Captain Hal Scharp—A S Barnes, 1975, 224 p., color plate, b&w photographs, \$9.95. Presents a lively portrait of the capricious behavior and biological construction of most common and some rare species of sharks, including commercial, medical and fishing aspects of the shark.

ESSENTIALS OF BIOLOGY—C. Leland Rodgers—Barron, 1975, rev. ed., 557 p., illus., tables, paper, \$3.95. Mini-text with up-to-date coverage of basic topics, study questions, and extensive glossary.

AN INTRODUCTION TO PERCEPTION—Irvin Rock—Macmillan, 1975, 592 p., illus., \$13. Text deals with the central phenomena and problems of perception—size, third dimension, direction, movement and events, form, illusions, and neutral color.

AN INTRODUCTION TO THE PRACTICAL STUDY OF CRYSTALS, MINERALS AND ROCKS—K. G. Cox, N. B. Price and B. Harte—Halsted Pr, 1975, rev. ed., 245 p., color chart, photographs, drawings, tables, paper, \$10.75. Supplementary text for introductory laboratory course, emphasizes the stereographic approach to morphological crystallography.

MAN-MACHINE SYSTEMS: Information, Control and Decision Models of Human Performance—Thomas B. Sheridan and William R. Ferrell—MIT Pr, 1974, 452 p., diagrams, \$25. Advanced text and reference. Attempts to bridge engineering and behavioral sciences by presenting selected, but related, aspects of human performance illumined by quantitative models.

PHYSICAL CHEMISTRY—Farrington Daniels and Robert A. Alberty—Wiley, 1975, 4th ed., 687 p., diagrams, \$15.95. Intended for comprehensive first course, emphasizes fundamentals for understanding thermodynamics, dynamics, quantum chemistry and structure.

PHYSICS AND THE PHYSICAL UNIVERSE—Jerry B. Marion—Wiley, 1975, 2nd ed., 612 p., photographs, diagrams, \$15.95. Nonmathematical, introductory physics text, combines survey of contemporary physics, astrophysics and cosmology.

A PRIMER OF DRUG ACTION—Robert M. Julien—W. H. Freeman, 1975, 300 p., illus., tables, \$11; paper, \$4.95. Undergraduate text, treats the pharmacology of psychoactive drugs in a manner intelligible to readers who may lack scientific background.

THE ROLE OF ADDITIVES IN PLASTICS—L. Mascia—Halsted Pr. 1975, 180 p., color plates, photographs, diagrams, \$12.50. Basic textbook on additives which relates current industrial practice to the underlying scientific principles involved.

SEPARATION METHODS IN CHEMICAL ANALY-SIS—James M. Miller—Wiley-Interscience, 1975, 319 p., diagrams, tables, \$14.95. Outlining major separation methods used in the analytical laboratory, text presents the basic theory of separation science and prepares the student to adopt new methods.

36 LECTURES IN BIOLOGY—S. E. Luria—MIT Pr, 1975, 458 p., diagrams, paper, \$17.95; paper, \$8.95. Lecture course for serious students, centers around one main theme, that of living organisms as possessors of a program—a set of genetic information that underlies all vital functions, and that evolves by mutation, genetic recombination and natural selection.
