AMONG THE ELEPHANTS—Iain and Oria Douglas-Hamilton—Viking Pr. 1975, 286 p., color & b&w photographs, maps, diagrams & drawings, \$14.95. Using transistors to track the animals, and cameras to record their activities, the Douglas-Hamiltons have documented life among the elephants in parks & reserves of Tanzania.

BIRDS AS PETS—Paul Villiard—Doubleday, 1974, photographs, 177 p., \$5.95. The care, feeding, housing, breeding and training of various birds including the care and treatment of some of the more common bird diseases.

DICTIONARY OF NUTRITION—Richard Ashly and Heidi Duggal—St. Martin's, 1975, 236 pp., \$8.95. Concise catalog of common foods and their nutritional value, including vitamin and carbohydrate contents.

DWARF SHRUBS—Donald Wyman—Macmillan, 1975, 137 p., color plates, drawings \$7.95. Describes 300 woody plants especially suited as low-growing, no-pruning shrubs.

FENCES, WALLS AND HEDGES—Jack Kramer—Scribner, 1975, 128 p., photographs, drawings, diagrams, \$8.95. Practical book discusses all kinds of man-made boundaries and how to build or plant them.

A GUIDE TO PSYCHOLOGISTS AND THEIR CONCEPTS—Vernon J. Norby and Calvin S. Hall—W. H. Freeman (Scribner), 1975, 179 p., 42 line drawings, name index, subject index, \$8. The lives and works of forty-two renowned psychologists—including Freud, Jung, Maslow, Fromm, Skinner and Piaget—discussed clearly for general readers.

HISTORY OF ROCKETRY AND SPACE TRAVEL—Wernher von Braun and Frederick I. Ordway III—Crowell, 1975, 287 p., \$25. Updated international history of space travel, with factual, detailed accounts of man's airborne experiences. With 350 photographs and drawings.

HUMAN ADAPTABILITY TO ANTARCTIC CONDITIONS: Antarctic Research Series, Vol. 22—E. K. Eric Gunderson, Ed—AGU (USGS), 1975, 140 p., photographs, diagrams, tables, \$13. Review of research on the physiological effects of the antarctic environment, includes results of major medical, behavioral and psychophysiological investigations.

LIFE AND THE HISTORICAL MOMENT—Erik H. Erikson—Norton, 1975, 283 p., \$9.95. Opens with autobiography, ranges through discussions of Freud, Ghandi and womanhood and concludes with an examination of the role of psychoanalysis in the evolution of ethics.

LOVE AND ADDICTION—Stanton Peele with Archie Brodsky—Taplinger, 1975, 288 p., \$9.95. Explores the true nature of interpersonal addiction stressing its psychological base and shows how to identify and avoid the repetition of self-destructive patterns.

MAGNETIC BUBBLES—T. H. O'Dell—Halsted Pr., 1974, b&w photographs, diagrams, 159 p., \$24.50. Introduction to the scientific principles underlying magnetic bubble domains. Describes recent applications to problems of data storage, processing and display.

MODELS OF MADNESS, MODELS OF MEDICINE—Miriam Siegler and Humphrey Osmond—Macmillan, 1974, 288 p., \$8.95. Analysis of the critical state of psychiatry today.

MOUNTAINS—John Cleare—Crown, 1975, 253 p., b&w photographs, color plates, \$12.50. Narrative of author's philosophy, adventures and advice about mountain climbing, world-wide.

STROKES AND THEIR PREVENTION—Arthur Ancowitz, M.D.—Van Nos Reinhold, 1975, 255 p., \$7.95. Uses layman's language to describe strokes, their causes, and preventive measures. Explores the degrees of disability and problems of rehabilitation after stroke.

TOTAL FITNESS—Laurence E. Morehouse and Leonard Gross—S&S, 1975, 221 p., \$6.95. Shows what physical fitness is and provides a practical thirty-minute a week exercise program.

URBAN DESIGN AND PLANNING CRITERIA—Joseph DeChiara and Lee Koppelman—Reinhold, 1975, 640 p., line drawings, \$35. Updated "how-to" text on planning major housing projects, with tips on land use, zoning concepts and transportation systems.

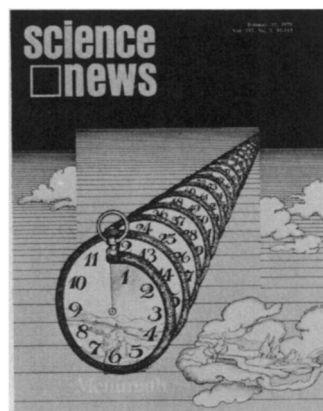
