ASIMOV ON PHYSICS—Isaac Asimov—Doubleday, 1976, 218 p., photographs, \$9.95. Conceptually arranged selection of out-of-print articles, ranging from one on thin air to an essay on the certainty of uncertainty.

CHINA: An Anthropological Perspective—Leon E. Stover and Takeko Kawai Stover—Goodyear, 1976, 258 p., diagrams, maps, \$9.95; paper, \$6.95. Presents China as the cumulative product of evolutionary change, from the Neolithic foundation of the early Bronze Age, through feudalism and empire, to the emergence of the sovereign nation-state.

CHROMOSOME HIERARCHY: An Introduction to the Biology of the Chromosome—Bernard John and Kenneth R. Lewis—Oxford U Pr, 1976, 180 p., illus., tables, \$19; paper, \$8. Covers the genetic, epigenetic and evolutionary aspects of chromosome structure and behavior, phylogenetic functions, and chromosome mutation.

COPING WITH THE OIL CRISIS: French and German Experiences—Horst Mendershausen—Johns Hopkins Pr, 1976, 124 p., graphs, tables, \$7.50; paper, \$2.95. Study explains and compares the traditional roles the two European countries have played in worldwide oil relations and how during the past two years this pattern has changed.

CRYSTALS, FABRICS AND FIELDS: Metaphors of Organicism in Twentieth-Century Developmental Biology—Donna Jeanne Haraway—Yale U Pr, 1976, 236 p., \$15. Detailed history and analysis of the work of biologists Harrison, Needham and Weiss explores the development of the study of organic growth by each.

THE DECISION TO GO TO THE MOON: Project Apollo and the National Interest—John M. Logsdon—U of Chicago Pr, 1976, 196 p., paper, \$3.95. Reprint of 1970 study, examines the influence of men and events leading to the lunar landing decision, and assesses the values, motivations and attitudes that produced such a concerted effort in the "national interest."

DECISIONS, DECISIONS: Game Theory and You—Robert Bell and John Coplans—Norton, 1976, 168 p., \$7.95. Delineates ways to assess the realities of personal problems, and uses case histories as instructive examples of step-by-step decision-making.

R. D. LAING: The Man and His Ideas—Richard I. Evans—Dutton, 1976, 245 p., \$12.95; paper, \$3.95. Contains dialogue with the existential psychoanalyst, biographical essay by Peter Mexan, and Laing's study of Kallman's and Slater's genetic theory of schizophrenia.

THE TROUBLED MIND: A Guide to Release from Distress—Solomon H. Snyder, M.D.—McGraw, 1976, 246 p., \$8.85. A helpful discussion of the varying states of depression, categories of schizophrenia, and the various brands of psychotherapy, psychoanalysis and group therapy.
