THE BIOLOGY OF CANCER: A New Approach—P.R.J.Burch—Univ Park, 1976, 452 p., diagrams, tables, \$29.50. Presents in detail a theory of cancer, together with supporting evidence, of the mechanisms of initiation of natural malignant neoplasms, independent of external environmental factors such as radiation, chemical carcinogens, or oncogenic viruses.

DESIGN FOR DIVERSITY: Planning for Natural Man in the Neotechnic Environment: An Ethological Approach—Barrie B. Greenbie—Am Elsevier Pub Co, 1976, 226 p., photographs, diagrams, \$29.95. Analyzes the social structure of a diversity of human settlements in search of new solutions that will provide for free movement and safe conduct of individuals into, out of and between groups.

DURABLE PLEASURES: A Practical Guide to Better Tape Recording—Hans Fantel—Dutton, 1976, 207 p., photographs, drawings, \$8.95. Surveys the various types of tape recorders, explains how they work, what determines their quality, and makes practical suggestions for making different kinds of recordings.

ENERGY: The Solar-Hydrogen Alternative—J. O'M. Bockris—Wiley, 1976, 383 p., illus., maps, tables, \$27.50. Deals with the time available for development of a new energy base, the hydrogen economy, solar energy technology, methods of transmission, hydrogen fuel production, energy storage, alternative economies, and stages in the development of a solar-hydrogen economy.

EVALUATION OF PSYCHOLOGICAL THERAPIES: Psychotherapies, Behavior Therapies, Drug Therapies and Their Interactions—Robert L. Spitzer and Donald F. Klein, Eds.—Johns Hopkins U Pr, 1976, 328 p., diagrams, tables, \$17. Papers and discussions evaluating individual psychoanalysis and psychotherapy, behavior therapy, and the combined use of pharmacological agents and psychotherapy.

FROM THE LANDS OF THE SCYTHIANS: Ancient Treasures from the Museums of the U.S.S.R., 3000 B.C. to 100 B.C.—NYGS (Lit-

tle), 1976, 9x11, 160 p., 33 color plates by Lee Boltin, b&w photographs, maps, \$17.50. Records the Metropolitan Museum of Art exhibition, together with essays on Scythian culture and history.

HELPLESSNESS: On Depression, Development and Death—Martin E. P. Seligman—W H Freeman (Scribner), 1975, 250 p., \$8.95. The theory presented is based on a growing body of evidence that shows how helplessness operates, and that when depressed individuals learn to exert greater control on their environment, their depression dissipates.

THE LONG-RUN AVAILABILITY OF PHOSPHORUS: A Case Study in Mineral Resource Analysis—Frederick J. Wells—Johns Hopkins U Pr, 1976, 142 p., tables, \$9.50. Estimates, analysis and conclusions concerning phosphorus reserves, exhaustion periods, costs, phosphate fertilizer consumption, conservation, and recycling.

MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS THROUGH THE AGES—Anthony Baines, Ed., foreword by David Amran—Walker & Co, 1976, 2nd ed., photographs, drawings, \$15. Both scholarly and readable, the copiously illustrated volume presents a comprehensive history of Western and non-Western ancient to current instruments, and the sounds they produce.

OPERATING ON THE MIND: The Psychosurgery Conflict—Willard M. Gaylin, Joel S. Meister and Robert C. Neville, Eds.—Basic Bks, 1976, 216 p., \$11.95. Investigators from many fields, ranging from neurology to law, present the diverse results of intensive research on the worthiness of psychosurgery as a therapeutic modality.

PRIMAL MAN: The New Consciousness—Arthur Janov and E. Michael Holden, M.D.—T Y Crowell, 1976, 544 p., diagrams, tables, \$10. Develops further basic research in Primal Theory and Primal Therapy, the system of techniques for treating psychophysiological afflictions.

PROFESSOR ON THE ICE—Robert E. Feeney—Pacific Portals, 1975, 164 p., photographs, maps, paper, \$4.95. Describes informally Antarctic working experiences of a specialist in protein biochemistry, engaged with his students and associates in long-range field studies of Adélie and emperor penguins and fish.

SCIENCE FOR SOCIETY: A Bibliography—Joseph M. Dasbach—AAAS, Office of Sci. Educ., 1976, 6th ed., 104 p., paper, \$3. Contains 2,500 annotated references grouped by issues, from aging to transportation; covers books (1972-75), and articles (July 1974 to July 1975).

A SENSE OF THE COSMOS: The Encounter of Modern Science and Ancient Truth—Jacob Needleman—Doubleday, 1975, 190 p., \$6.95. Deals with the contemporary metaphysical awakening of modern science, explores the central scientific teachings about the physical universe, mind, body and organic life, as well as ancient sacred teachings of magic.

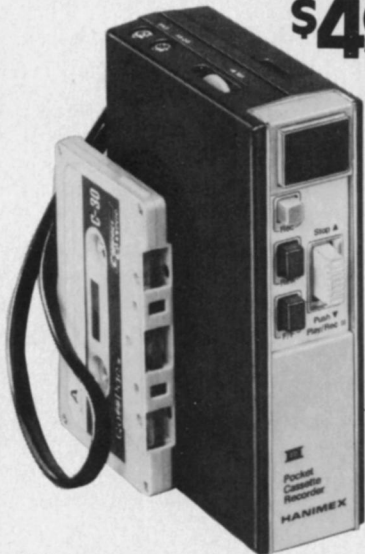
