**ALPHA CENTAURI:** The Nearest Star—Isaac Asimov—Lothrop, 1976, 200 p., tables, \$7.95. Besides dealing with the third brightest star, the book, in simple terms, makes clear how the distances of stars are determined, their spectral light, size and change.

**ANIMAL DOCTOR**—Lucas Younker and John J. Fried—Dutton, 354 p., photographs, \$8.95. The story of a happy veterinarian whose practice with small animals and horses includes application of acupuncture.

**CROWS OF THE WORLD**—Derek Goodwin—Cornell U Pr, 1976, 9x11, 360 p., color plates, illus. by Robert Gillmor, maps \$28.50.

Authoritative guide to all 116 species of Corvidae, a diverse group of passerines including jays, magpies, rooks and the raven.

**DEATH, DYING AND THE BIOLOGICAL REVOLUTION:** Our Last Quest for Responsibility—Robert M. Veatch—Yale U Pr, 1976, 332 p., \$12.95. Examines the relationship between the public policy commitment to use all available technology to extend life and the patient's right and responsibility to make decisions about his own dying.

**THE ELECTRIC WAR:** The Fight Over Nuclear Power—Sheldon Novick—Sierra, 1976, 376 p., photographs, \$12.50. Tries to give a simultaneous view of the people who make up the great struggle over nuclear power and of the arenas in which they battle—government, corporations and private utilities; describes the shape of the nuclear-power industry and the struggle to control it.

**THE ENZYME MOLECULE**—W. Ferdinand—Wiley, 1976, 305 p., diagrams, \$22; paper, \$10.95. Deals with the role of enzymes in biology, the catalytic and regulatory, structural and kinetic aspects of enzymes.

**THE GAME OF DISARMAMENT:** How the United States and Russia Run the Arms Race—Alva Myrdal—Pantheon, 1976, 420 p., \$15. A detailed account of the arms race and the militarization of our world, summarizes the growing danger of nuclear proliferation, analyzes the diplomatic efforts and explains how negotiations have tended to institutionalize the arms race rather than reverse it.

**GLACIERS AND LANDSCAPE:** A Geomorphological Approach—David E. Sugden and Brian S. John—Arnold (Halsted Pr), 1976, 384 p., photographs, diagrams, tables, \$30; paper, \$12.50. Profusely illustrated, monograph examines the properties of glacier ice, the distribution and worldwide fluctuation of glaciers,

analyzes the erosional and depositional effects on landforms and landscapes.

**THE HITE REPORT:** A Nationwide Study on Female Sexuality—Shere Hite—Macmillan, 1976, 438 p., \$12.50. Reports on interviews with 3,000 women revealing women's attitudes toward sex.

**HOMEOWNER'S GUIDE TO SOLAR HEATING AND COOLING**—William M. Foster—TAB Bks, 1976, 196 p., illus., tables, \$7.95; paper, \$4.95. Advice on how to select, install and maintain solar heating and cooling, and hot water systems.

**HOW TO SAVE ENERGY AND CUT COSTS IN EXISTING INDUSTRIAL AND COMMERCIAL BUILDINGS:** An Energy Conservation Manual—Fred S. Dubin, Harold L. Mindell and Selwyn Bloome—Noyes, 1976, 725 p., diagrams, tables, \$24. Energy-saving guidelines, addressed to owners and operators of buildings, and to engineers and architects.

**IMMUNOLOGY, AGING AND CANCER:** Medical Aspects of Mutation and Selection—F. M. Burnet—W H Freeman, 1976, 170 p., diagrams, \$9.95; paper, \$6.50. Topics of lectures range from clonal selection and antibody to autoimmune disease.

**THE LAST PRIMITIVE PEOPLES**—Robert Brain—Crown, 1976, 8x10, 288 p., 32 color plates, 168 b&w photograph, maps, \$14.95. An informative survey of living tribal communities, shows their social customs, rites and rituals, with anthropologist's commentary.

**LOWELL AND MARS**—William Graves Hoyt—U of Ariz Pr, 1976, 390 p., photographs, \$13.95; paper, \$8.50. Not so much a biography as an annotated study of a man's mind, a man's ideas which, right or wrong, were influential in stimulating other astronomers' minds.

**THE MIRACLE FINDERS:** The Stories Behind the Most Important Breakthroughs of Modern Medicine—Donald Robinson—McKay, 1976, 345 p., \$10.95. Based on interviews with more than 100 medical researchers, the book provides some fresh insight into medical advances.

**A NATURAL HISTORY OF MARINE MAMMALS**—Victor B. Scheffer—Scribner, 1976, 162 p., illus. by Peter Parnall, \$7.95. Tells how marine mammals evolved, describes anatomy, physiology and behavior which characterize the various species.

**THE ORIGIN OF CONSCIOUSNESS IN THE BREAKDOWN OF THE BICAMERAL MIND**—Julian Jaynes—H-M, 1977, 478 p., drawings, \$12.95. Recent laboratory studies with the brain's hemispheres and study of archaeological evidence are the bases of psychologist's hypothesis that contemporary consciousness is not the product of animal evolution but of human history and culture. The author concludes his study with deductions to explain some modern phenomena.

**PLATE TECTONICS AND CRUSTAL EVOLUTION**—Kent C. Condie—Pergamon, 1976, 300 p., drawings, tables, \$22.50. A readable text discussing the role of plate tectonics in the geologic past examined in the light of existing evidence and examples of plate reconstructions.

**THE POWERHOLDERS**—David Kipnis—U of Chicago Pr, 1976, 230 p., tables, \$12.50. Explores the psychological aspects of using power to influence the behavior or beliefs of others in a variety of settings including examples of presidents, military officers, corporate executives, union leaders, husbands, wives and parents.
