THE DRAGONS OF EDEN: Speculations on the Evolution of Human Intelligence—Carl Sagan—Random, 1977, 263 p., illus., \$8.95. A better understanding of the nature and evolution of human intelligence might help us to deal with our unknown and perilous future as well as aid us in our quest for extraterrestrial intelligence.

ENERGY: The Continuing Crisis—Norman Metzger—T. Y. Crowell, 1977, 242 p., illus., \$12.95. Offering a "jaundiced" view on energy supply and the control of its demand, including some specific considerations—how we got into difficulty, what is to be done and whether material scarcities will repeat the unpleasant history of energy scarcities.

THE EVERYMAN PROJECT: Resources for a Humane Future—Robert Jungk—Liveright, 1977, 288 p., \$10.95. From the study of nature and the struggle to control it, we are moving into a new period where man is attempting to understand and develop himself. The author has sought out signs and trends pointing away from present discontent towards a better future. "Man is not facing his end ... he is only now reaching his full development."

HABITS: How We Get Them, Why We Keep Them, How We Kick Them—Richard Stiller—

Nelson, 1977, 157 p., diagrams, \$6.95. The ease with which humans become habituated is an important intellectual advantage. Without this ability to form new habits we might not have survived as a species. This readable book is about the psychological, physiological and philosophical aspects of habit.

THE HITTITES: People of a Thousand Gods—Johannes Lehmann, translated by J. Maxwell Brownjohn—Viking Pr, 1977, 315 p., illus., \$11.95. This extraordinary civilization which controlled half the known world from 1700 to 1200 B.C. vanished from history for 3,000 years. Telling of the rediscovery of this long lost empire and how the Hittites lived, conquered, worshipped and perished.

AN INTRODUCTION TO BIOLOGICAL RHYTHMS—David S. Saunders—Halsted Pr., 170 p., charts and diagrams, \$11.95. The study of biological rhythms is a truly integrated biology. This book is designed to cover the field of biochronometry for the advanced undergraduate.

THE LIFE SCIENCE: Current Ideas of Biology—P. B. Medawar and J. S. Medawar—Har-Row, 1977, 196 p., \$8.95. For those who wish to know something of the conceptual framework of modern biology.

MADNESS, MAGIC AND MEDICINE: The Treatment and Mistreatment of the Mentally III—Elinor Lander Horwitz—Lippincott, 1977, 191 p., illus., \$6.95. Tracing the history of human tragedies caused by alkylmercurials directly or as a result of environmental contamination, as well as the applications of the liquid element in industry and medicine.

NEWCOMB'S WILDFLOWER GUIDE: An Ingenious New Key System for Quick, Positive Field Identification of the Wildflowers, Flowering Shrubs and Vines of Northeastern and North-central North America—Lawrence Newcomb—Little, 1977, 490 p., illus. by Gordon Morrison, \$6.95.

PULSARS—F. G. Smith—Cambridge U Pr, 1977, 239 p., diagrams, tables, \$19.50. Describes the whole range of observational material on pulsars relating it to theoretical work on the interior of neutron stars and on the regions outside the star which radiate the radio waves. The relation of pulsars to supernovae is explored by examining the ages of pulsars and their distribution through the galaxy.
