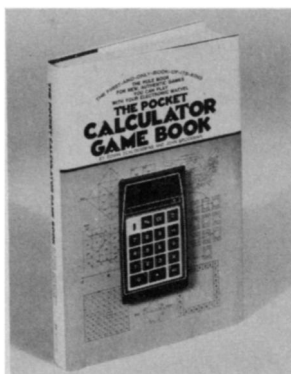

COLONIES IN SPACE—T. A. Heppenheimer—Stackpole, 1977, 224 p., illus., drawings, \$12.95. Even if we can not find planets fit for man to live on, the author feels we can build colonies in space "as pleasant as we want and productive enough to markedly improve humanity's future prospects." Detailing architecture and design, farming and food, recreation and fun in space colonies.

DEPRESSION: Clinical, Biological and Psychological Perspective—Gene Usdin, Ed.—Brunner/Mazel, 1977, 346 p., charts, diagrams, \$15. 1976 annual meeting publication of the American College of Psychiatrists presents survey of the field for the psychotherapist, psychopharmacologist and the clinician treating depressed patients.

EXPLORING THE LAND AND ROCKS OF SOUTHERN ILLINOIS: A Geological Guide—Stanley E. Harris, Jr. et al.—Southern Ill. U Pr., 1977, 240 p., maps, diagrams, illus., \$11.85, paper, \$5.95. Written for nature lovers and students, this beautifully illustrated book describes features, rocks and sediments that make up this area of the country.

FLIGHT TO MERCURY—Bruce Murray and Eric Burgess—Columbia U Pr., 1977, 162 p., illus., \$12.95. The first flight to Mercury, how it came to be and then following the course of Mariner 10 from its liftoff in November 1973 to its third encounter with Mercury in 1975. Contains more than 100 photographs which provided us with our first view of the surface features and geology of Mercury.

THE HORSE—J. Warren Evans et al.—W. H. Freeman, 1977, 766 p., illus., \$25.00. A reference, a text, and for those who love horses, this comprehensive work covers history, breeds, racing, recreation use, biology, nutrition, reproduction, genetics, health and management in chapters written by nine different experts in their fields.

LIES, DAMN LIES, AND STATISTICS: The Manipulation of Public Opinion in America—Michael Wheeler—Dell, 1977, 320 p., paper, \$2.50. This book about opinion polls—how they are used and abused, was first published in 1976.

PSYCHOLOGISTS ON PSYCHOLOGY—David Cohen—Taplinger, 1977, 360 p., \$12.95, paper, \$6.50. In-depth interviews with 13 eminent psychologists chosen to reflect the widest possible range of approaches. Discussing the complexities of the psychologists' areas of concern and experiments, how they arrived at their conclusions and where they think they are headed.

THE RACE BOMB: Skin Color, Prejudice, and Intelligence—Paul R. Ehrlich and S. Shirley Feldman—Quadrangle, 1977, 207 p., diagrams, \$9.95. Dealing with the complexities of the race-intelligence issue in lay terms. "Myths of racial inferiority and superiority must not be allowed to poison human relations further."
