**ANNUAL REVIEW OF ENERGY, Vol 2**—Jack M. Hollander et al, Eds. — Annual Reviews, 1977, 522 p., illus., \$17. Provides analyses from a variety of perspectives on global, international and national issues surrounding the production, trade and use of energy.

**THE CAMBRIDGE ENCYCLOPAEDIA OF ASTRONOMY** — Simon Mitton, Ed. — Crown, 1977, 495 p., color & b&w photographs and drawings, \$35. Draws together many remarkable discoveries and presents them in context through a series of themes rather than by an alphabetical list. Mirrors the interests of active astronomers without ignoring the achievements of classical astronomy. The text is complemented by many diagrams and photographs.

**CLIMATE, PRESENT, PAST AND FUTURE, VOL. 2: Climatic History and the Future**—H. H. Lamb—Methuen (B&N), 1977, 835 p., illus., \$85. Presents an outline of the past record of climate and the many types of evidence on which knowledge of climate can now be built. Designed to serve as a guidebook to the science of climatology and climate development, which touches nearly every aspect of our lives and environment.

**THE END OF THE GAME: The Last Word from Paradise** — Peter H. Beard — Doubleday, 1977, 280 p., illus., paper, \$9.95. A documentary with spectacular photographs, often shocking, of the origins, history and prospects of big game in Africa. Revised and updated edition of a book published by Viking Press in 1965.

**FIFTY COMMON BIRDS OF OKLAHOMA AND THE SOUTHERN GREAT PLAINS** — George Miksch Sutton—U of Okla Pr, 113 p., color plates, \$7.95. Fifty of the more common birds were selected for inclusion from among 400 birds seen in Oklahoma. Beautifully illustrated with color plates for each bird described. The text tells of the birds' seasonal status, changes in plumage, food and breeding habits.

**THE GENETIC CONNECTION: How to Protect Your Family Against Hereditary Disease** — David Hendin and Joan Marks — Morrow, 1978, 251 p., \$8.95. A simple and practical discussion of heredity, information about genetic disorders and the new techniques available to help reduce the risk of genetic disease.

**THE HARD-TO-TEACH CHILD: A Diagnostic-Remedial Approach**—Denis H. Stott—Univ Park, 1978, 181 p., illus., paper, \$8.95. An approach to education that is based on a study of how the child uses capabilities and how this can be improved. A demonstration project in Toronto using this approach is discussed.

**THE HOG BOOK**—William Hedgepeth—Doubleday, 1978, 272 p., illus., \$10, paper, \$6.95. Hogs in history, mythology and ritual, in art, sports and show business. Hog poems, songs and proposals outlining radical roles for hogs to play in the "new age," along with hog husbandry and, finally, butchering.

**HOW INDUSTRIAL SOCIETIES USE ENERGY: A Comparative Analysis**—Joel Darmstadter et al—Johns Hopkins, 1977, 282 p., charts & graphs, \$16.95. This Resources for the Future book makes clear the complexity of factors affecting dif-

ferences in energy use among nations and the difficulty in measuring efficiency and wastefulness in energy consumption.

**LIVING WITH ENERGY** — Ronald Alves — Penguin, 1978, 128 p., photographs by Charles Milligan, paper, \$5.95. A blueprint of energy, architectural and life-style alternatives to the use of expensive energy technologies dependent on fossil fuels and uranium.

**LOVE SONGS OF ARNHEM LAND**—Ronald M. Berndt — U of Chicago Pr, 1978, 244 p., illus., \$17.50. Looks at Australian aboriginal erotic activity and belief through the medium of traditional love songs. Photographs include drawings by Australian aborigines.

**MIND CONTROL**—Peter Schrag — Pantheon, 1978, 327 p., \$10. An account of methods being developed and used to control behavior, how and on whom they are used, the organizations which use them, the ideology on which they are based and the extensive effects, personal and social, which they create.

**PARENT POWER**—John Douglas — Enterprise Pub (Newspaper Ent), 1977, 120 p., paper, \$1.75. Outlines what parents can do, alone or in groups, to be sure their child receives the best possible education. Tells how to evaluate the local school, what IQ tests really show, how to meet and work with the child's teacher and how to encourage joyful learning at home.

**PERSPECTIVES ON THE ENERGY CRISIS, VOLUME 2: Mankind's Energy Challenge, Fossil Fuels, Solar, Nuclear, Regional/National Responses**—Howard Gordon and Roy Meador, Eds. — Ann Arbor Science, 1977, 536 p., illus., \$24.50. The reports included give the current dimensions of the energy problem and evaluate prospects for various energy technologies. These reports were selected to give timely assistance and reference data to those responsible for energy decisions in government and industry.

**PLANTS FROM NINE TO FIVE: Gardening Where You Work** — Paul Tenenbaum — Scribner, 1977, 96 p., illus., \$7.95. Forty varieties of plants, large and small, that can survive the special maintenance conditions that office space and hours demand. Covers watering, exposure to light and cold air, dust, humidity or the lack of it, fertilizing and plant ailments.

**PLAY AND AGGRESSION: A Study of Rhesus Monkeys** — Donald Symons — Columbia U Pr, 1978, 246 p., illus., \$20. A qualitative and quantitative description of aggressive play with the object of clarifying its function. The author theorizes that the primary function of aggressive play is the practice and perfection of skills in predator avoidance and fighting.

**THE PUNCTURED THUMB: Or, Cactus and Other Succulents**—George Ashley—One Hund One Prods (Scribner), 1977, 168 p., drawings, paper, \$4.95. A humorous guide to raising cactus and other succulents. Some 70 genera are described in detail with notes on their cultivation.

**THE SAPPHIRE PLANET** — Uri Lanham — Columbia U Pr, 1978, 138 p., \$9.95. A biography of the earth describing the position of the planet in the universe, the internal physiology of the earth, its biosphere and life upon the earth.

**SOLAR ENERGY AND BUILDING** — S. V. Szokolay — Halsted Pr, 2nd ed., 1977, 174 p., illus., \$18.50. In this new edition the author has added the important developments in this rapidly expanding field since the original publication in 1974. A new section includes a country-by-country survey of recent developments.

**SYMBOLIC ANTHROPOLOGY: A Reader in the Study of Symbols and Meanings**—Janet

L. Dolgin et al, Eds. — Columbia U Pr, 1977, 523 p., drawings., \$27.50, paper, \$10. The 29 articles are concerned with the objects, persons, relations and acts through which peoples communicate within their cultures, and with the interrelations of these elements.

**WE LIVE IN THE ALASKAN BUSH** — Tom Walker — Alaska Northwest, 1977, 135 p., illus., paper, \$7.95. Tells of a rugged, isolated life for the Walkers and their small daughter in a log cabin with a spectacular view of Mt. McKinley. Describes practical details that made such a life possible, as well as the rewards of bush living. The charming photographs and drawings enhance the text.

**WHY BIG FIERCE ANIMALS ARE RARE: An Ecologist's Perspective** — Paul Colinvaux — Princeton U Pr, 1978, 256 p., \$9.50. A lively survey of modern ecology's central ideas written for the layman. Each chapter explores a separate theme. A bibliography is included.

**WORLD GUIDE TO SCIENTIFIC ASSOCIATIONS AND LEARNED SOCIETIES**—Verlag Dokumentation (Bowker), 2nd ed., 1978, 510 p., \$49.50. A listing of more than 11,000 associations and societies from all fields of science, technology and the arts arranged by country. Includes address, president or director, executive secretary and number of members for each organization. A subject index is included. This reference work was compiled in the Federal Republic of Germany.
