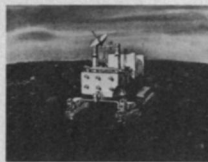

**EUROPE'S GIANT ACCELERATOR: The Story of the CERN 400 GeV Proton Synchrotron**—Maurice Goldsmith and Edwin Shaw—Taylor & Francis (Crane-Russak Co), 1977, 261 p., illus., \$27.50. The story begins in 1960 with preliminary discussions, evolves around 1963 into a programming phase and, with the collaboration of 12 western European countries, enters into the construction period in 1971, culminating in the achievement of its design energy in 1976.

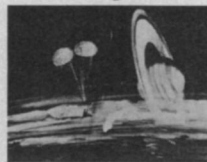

**NONVERBAL BEHAVIOR AND COMMUNICATION**—Aron W. Siegman and Stanley Feldstein, Eds.—LEA (Halsted Pr), 1978, 400 p., illus., \$19.95. The authors present their most recent research for this volume in which nonverbal communication is viewed as a part of the total communication process.

**ON MOUNTAINS: Thinking About Terrain**—John Jerome—Harbrace, 1978, 262 p., illus., \$8.95. "For people who have never quite gotten over the thrill of having something huge and solid and natural out there making the horizon interesting." Explains the science and the dangers of mountains and discusses their beauty and charm.

**PARENTS' YELLOW PAGES**—Frank Caplan, Ed.—Anch. Doubleday, 1978, 511 p., illus., paper, \$7.95. A well organized directory for parents giving information on many aspects of childrearing. Suggests sources to obtain even more information.

**PEPTIDES: Proceedings of the Fifth American Peptide Symposium**—Murray Goodman and Johannes Meienhofer, Eds.—Halsted Pr, 612 p., illus., \$30. The symposium was held June 20 to June 24, 1977, at the University of California at San Diego, with representatives from more than 20 nations participating. Major areas of emphasis involved brain peptides, advances in analytical methodology and conformational studies of peptides, polypeptides and proteins.

**PHYSICAL SCIENCE IN THE MIDDLE AGES**—Edward Grant—Cambridge U Pr, 1977, 128 p., \$12.95, paper, \$4.95. This book, originally published in 1971, describes briefly the significant scientific developments and interpretations formulated in western Europe from the period of the late Roman Empire to approximately A.D. 1500.

**PRIVILEGED ONES: The Well-Off and the Rich in America, Volume V of Children of Crisis**—Robert Coles—Little, 1977, 583 p., illus., \$15. A study of privileged children from ages five to 14 living in many different parts of the United States. There are, according to the author, striking similarities in the behavior and concerns of these children. Each of them is faced with many choices, and although they feel lucky to have choices, they may feel overwhelmed by decisions, responsibilities and material possessions.

**THE SCIENTIFIC IMAGINATION: CASE STUDIES**—Gerald Holton—Cambridge U Pr, 1978, 382 p., \$27.50, paper, \$7.95. Presents concepts and methods to increase our understanding of the imagination of scientists engaged in the act of doing science.
