AIR FACTS & FEATS—John W. R. Taylor et al.—Sterling, A Guinness Book, rev. ed., 1978, 240 p., b&w and color photographs, \$14.95. Tells of pioneering flights, research craft, military and civilian aircraft, rotocraft and flying for sport and competition. Appendix includes air records.

BASIC FOR HOME COMPUTERS—Bob Albrecht et al.—Wiley, 1978, 336 p., illus., paper, \$5.95. A self-teaching guide with step-by-step instructions, exercises and reviews teaches the reader, with or without access to a computer, to read, write and understand the BASIC programming language.

FIRES IN THE SKY: The Birth and Death of Stars—Roy A. Gallant—Four Winds, 1978, 162 p., illus., \$7.95. This simply written astronomy book discusses the characteristics of stars using the sun as the focus. Describes measurements that you can make and tells of the birth of the stars, of the different kinds and stages of their evolution and of their deaths. Photographs and diagrams enhance the text.

FISH PROTEIN CONCENTRATE: Panacea for Protein Malnutrition?—Ernst R. Pariser et al.—MIT Pr, 1978, 296 p., \$17.50. Charts the rising and falling expectations of the protein concentrate as a solution to the world food crisis.

GERMAN-ENGLISH SCIENCE DICTIONARY—Louis De Vries and Leon Jacolev—McGraw, 4th ed., 1978, 628 p., \$14.50. A concise dictionary, featuring more than 25,000 main entries, that gives the latest terminologies for the sciences. A list of abbreviations, plus those used for German scientific periodicals, is included.

GROWING & SAVING VEGETABLE SEEDS—Marc Rogers—Garden Way, 1978, 140 p., illus., paper, \$4.95. If you raise and save seed, with careful selection over several generations of plants, you can produce plants best suited to your climate and your gardening conditions.

HUMANIZING HEALTH CARE: ALTERNATIVE FUTURES FOR MEDICINE—Robert F. Rushmer—MIT Pr, 1978, 210 p., illus., paper, \$4.95. Designed to demonstrate mechanisms by which problem areas can be more clearly recognized, the principal issues identified and possible options evaluated in terms of advantages, disadvantages and consequences. Originally published in hardback in 1975.

INFANT CULTURE—Jane Flannery Jackson and Joseph H. Jackson—T Y Crowell, 1978, 239 p., \$9.95. Presents for parents and those who deal with babies professionally an account of infant capabilities through the first year. Based on recent research in this field.

THE LUCK OF NINEVEH: Archaeology's Great Adventure—Arnold C. Brackman—McGraw, 1978, 349 p., \$14.95. The story of Austin Henry Layard and the dramatic discovery in 1847 of the ruins of the lost city Nineveh, the seat of the Assyrian empire that had collapsed in 600 B. C.

THE MIND IN SLEEP: Psychology and Psychophysiology—Arthur M. Arkin et al., Eds.—LEA (Halsted Pr), 1978, 653 p., charts & graphs, \$29.95. To provide a comprehensive history and critical account of research on mental activities during sleep since the introduction in 1953 of the new electrographic techniques.

THE NATURAL WAY TO STRESS CONTROL—Sidney Lecker—G&D, 1978, 204 p., \$8.95. Explains the principles of a program of stress management for top executives and shows how the techniques can be extended to cope with stressful situations in everyday life.

THE OZONE WAR—Lydia Dotto and Harold Schiff—Doubleday, 1978, 342 p., \$10. The story of the controversy during the 1970s among science, government and industry over the ozone layer and the damage being done to it by man.

THE PENGUIN BOOK OF PETS: A Practical Guide to Animal-Keeping—Emil P. Dolensek and Barbara Burn—Penguin, 1978, 382 p., photographs by Bruce Buchenholz, paper, \$4.95. Written for the animal lover, with information about pets of all kinds—mammals, reptiles, birds, fish and insects. Originally published in 1976 as *A Practical Guide to Impractical Pets*.

POCKET CALCULATORS: How to Use and Enjoy Them—Arnold Madison and David L. Drotar—Nelson, 1978, 144 p., illus., \$6.95. Tells how to choose the appropriate calculator, how calculators work, how to make use of a calculator at school, at home, in the automobile and with sports. Includes tricks, games and puzzles.

THE POLICY PREDICAMENT: Making and Implementing Public Policy—George C. Edwards III and Ira Sharkansky—W H Freeman, 1978, 336 p., \$11.95. Concentrates on the problems that hinder the smooth translation of public needs through policy into benefits.

PRESCRIPTION DRUGS AND THEIR SIDE EFFECTS—Edward L. Stern—G&D, rev. ed., 1978, 135 p., paper, \$4.95. Intended to alert consumers to the possible side effects and adverse reactions of 220 prescription drugs.

PRINCIPLES & APPLICATIONS OF SOLAR ENERGY—Paul N. Cheremisinoff and Thomas C. Regino—Ann Arbor Science, 1978, 249 p., illus., \$15. An overview of the major aspects of solar energy technology for the general reader.

RECOMBINANT DNA: The Untold Story—John Lear—Crow, 1978, 280 p., diagrams, \$8.95. A history of recombinant DNA technology, its benefits and hazards, the scientists involved in this research and their positions. The author feels the issue is: Who will control "this awesome new discovery," the scientists or the people?

SMALL SYSTEMS COMPUTER SOURCE BOOK—J.C. Boonham, Ed.—Rococo Pr(Halsted Pr), 1978, 148 p., illus., paper, \$14.95. Gives a representative selection of small computer systems whose costs are within reach of hobbyists or small-business users. Details the hardware and the software available—the basic physical equipment together with the programs to operate the equipment.

VARIABILITY WITHIN AND AMONG NATURAL POPULATIONS—Sewall Wright—U of Chicago Pr, 1978, 580 p., charts & graphs, \$37.50. Analyzes variability observed within and among local populations of species and considers the implications for the evolutionary process. The publication of this volume completes Dr. Wright's four volume treatise, *Evolution and the Genetics of Populations*.

THE WHITE-COLLAR CHALLENGE TO NUCLEAR SAFEGUARDS—Herbert Edelhertz and Marilyn Walsh—Lexington Bks (Heath), 1978, 101 p., \$10.95. Examines the possible deficiencies in established nuclear security procedures in the light of the motivations and demonstrated ingenuity of white-collar criminals.

YOUR BABY'S MIND AND HOW IT GROWS: Piaget's Theory for Parents—Mary Ann Spencer Pulaski—Har-Row, 1978, 208 p., illus., \$8.95. A book about babies, how they grow and respond intelligently to the world around them up to the age of three. Looking through Piaget's eyes, the pioneer in the study of cognitive development in children, we can see the baby learning right from birth about her body, the world around her and how to make it work for her.

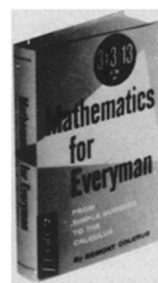

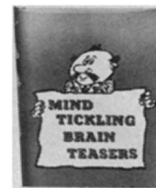
