BADGERS — Ernest G. Neal — Blandford Pr (Sterling), 1977, 321 p., illus., \$14.95. Intended as a reference book for the zoologist and informed naturalist as well as for all those interested in this burrowing animal. Beautiful color photographs.

CHILDREN AT RISK — Gary A. Crow — Schoc-ken, 1978, 280 p., \$12.95. A handbook of the signs and symptoms that point to early childhood difficulties, focusing on children between the ages of five and eight years. Intended to alert parents and those who work with children professionally to potential problems.

COLOR IN PLANTS AND FLOWERS — John and Susan Proctor — Everest Hse, 1978, 116 p., illus., \$9.95. Explains how plant colors are produced, how humans and other animals see the colors and why the colors are necessary for plant survival. Beautifully illustrated with color photographs and drawings.

CURRENT ISSUES IN U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL POLICY — Paul R. Portney, Ed. — Johns Hopkins, 1978, 207 p., charts & graphs, \$15; paper, \$4.95. This Resources for the Future publication evaluates the goals of the major environmental legislation, rethinks the tools used to get the job done and suggests alternatives for improvement.

DIOXIN: Toxicological and Chemical Aspects — Flaminio Cattabeni et al, Eds., Spectrum Pub (Halsted Pr), 1978, 222 p., graphs & charts, \$20. Recent advances in the chemistry, analysis, toxicology and decontamination of dioxin (TCDD) presented at a workshop held in Milan, October 1976 shortly after TCDD was released over a wide and densely populated area near Milan.

THE MAMMALS OF THE PALAEOARCTIC REGION: A Taxonomic Review — G. B. Corbet — Cornell U Press, 1978, 314 p., maps, \$38.50. The current state of the classification of the mammals from the Palaearctic Region, which includes Europe, Asia north of the Himalayas and Africa north of the Sahara. Brief introductory notes to the orders, families and genera provide keys for identification.

THE MEANING OF ANXIETY — Rollo May — Norton, rev. ed., 1977, 425 p., \$11.95. The confrontation with anxiety can relieve us from boredom, sharpen our sensitivity and assure the presence of the tension that is necessary to preserve human existence, says the author in the revised edition of this study of anxiety originally published in 1950.

THE NATURAL HISTORY OF THE WHALE — L. Harrison Matthews — Columbia U Pr, 1978, 219 p., illus., \$19.95. Examines whale physiology and behavior, these mammals' relationship to the undersea environment and their chances for survival.

NATURE DAY AND NIGHT — Richard Adams and Max Hooper — Viking Pr, 1978, 108 p., illus., \$10. A novelist, a scientist and an artist combine to look at the cycle of nature through night and day, recording the changes that occur in different English landscapes through one 24-hour period in June.

NEW AMERICAN POCKET MEDICAL DICTIONARY — Jane Clark Jackson — Churchill, 1978, 380 p., illus., paper, \$4.95. Adapted from the 13th edition (1978) of *Pocket Medical Dictionary* by Nancy Roper, which was first published in England in 1933.

THE POLITICS OF PAIN — Helen Neal — McGraw, 1978, 222 p., \$9.95. Written, says the author, to let people in on the numerous choices there are now for controlling pain, where to get help and their right as medical consumers to participate in decisions regarding pain treatment.

PRACTICAL GUIDE TO SOLAR HOMES — Editors of *Hudson Home Guides* — Van Nos Reinhold, 1978, 140 p., illus., \$10.95. Intended to make the basic principles of solar energy and its architectural applications understandable to the layman. Presents plans and sketches for 30 new solar homes for which detailed predesigned blueprints are available.

PSYCHOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVES IN YOUTH SPORTS — Frank L. Smoll and Ronald E. Smith, Eds. — Hemisphere (Halsted Pr), 1978, 287 p., charts & graphs, \$22.50. Based on a symposium held at the University of Washington, March 1977, jointly sponsored by the psychology and physical education departments.

REPAIRS, REUSE, RECYCLING — FIRST STEPS TOWARD A SUSTAINABLE SOCIETY — Denis Hayes — Worldwatch Inst Paper 23, 1978, 45 p., paper, \$2. At least two-thirds of the material resources that we use could be recycled without important changes in our life-styles says the author of this report.

THE SOCIOBIOLOGY DEBATE: Readings on Ethical and Scientific Issues — Arthur L. Caplan, Ed. — Har-Row, 514 p., \$12.95. The papers and materials selected are intended to provide a basis for advancing rational discussion of sociobiology.

THE SHORTER SCIENCE AND CIVILISATION IN CHINA: An Abridgement of Joseph Needham's Original Text, Vol. I — Colin A. Ronan — Cambridge U Pr, 1978, 326 p., illus., \$19.95. Covers the material in Vol I, *Introductory Orientations* and Vol II, *History of Scientific Thought* of Needham's original series and is intended to make his scholarly work available to the general public.

STRUCTURE IN NATURE IS A STRATEGY FOR DESIGN — Peter Pearce — MIT Pr, 1978, 245 p., illus., \$45. The structural designs that occur in nature — in crystals, molecules, cells and galaxies — are, according to the author, a proper source of inspiration for design of man-made structures. Nature at all levels builds structures that conserve materials and energy resources through the use of modular components.

VIOLENCE AND RESPONSIBILITY: The Individual, the Family and Society — Robert L. Sadoff, Ed. — Spectrum Pub (Halsted Pr), 1978, 139 p., \$14.95. Approaches the problem from a medical, legal and psychological perspective and focuses on violent behavior in relation to family members and children and on general aspects of violence related to the responsibility of individuals, families and the community.

A WALK THROUGH THE YEAR — Edwin Way Teale — Dodd, 1978, 408 p., photographs by the author, \$15. America's leading naturalist invites the reader on his daily walks along the paths of Trail Wood, his New York State woodland home. While walking these paths, which wind through meadow and brooks, swamps and wood, Teale shares his keen observations, his reflections and his meditations.

WATER IN ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING — Thomas Dunne and Luna B. Leopold — W H Freeman, 1978, 818 p., illus., \$30. Reviews the principles underlying the role of water in environ-

mental planning. Intended to make environmental planners aware of the opportunities and constraints of natural processes in maintaining or reclaiming environmental quality.

WILD FOODS — Laurence Pringle — Four Winds, 1978, 182 p., illus., drawings by Paul Breeden, \$9.95. An introduction to the world of edible wild foods. Tells where to find, how to identify, how to harvest and how to prepare the edible parts of available plants.

THE YEAR OF THE ANT — George Ordish — Scribner, 1978, 139 p., drawings by Clarke Hutton, \$9.95. The life story of a worker ant in a colony of wood ants forms the basis for a fascinating look at the wood ant and its world.
