THE AMBIDEXTROUS UNIVERSE: Mirror Asymmetry and Time-Reversed Worlds — Martin Gardner — Scribner, 2nd ed., 1979, 293 p., illus., \$9.95. Originally published in 1964, this book has been revised, updated and expanded to include five new chapters on the latest speculations on time and how they relate to physics and cosmology.

ATLAS OF MAN — John Gaisford — St Martin, 1978, 272 p., color illus., \$25. A beautifully illustrated book describing the main groups of people, more than 400, living in the world today. A general introduction to the various areas where the groups are found gives a perspective on the circumstances in which the inhabitants live. An opening section looks at mankind from a worldwide point of view and serves as an introduction to the themes that recur throughout the book.

BOTANICAL ILLUSTRATION — Ronald King — Potter (Crown), 1978, 40 p., 40 color plates and b&w illus., \$14.95, paper; \$6.95. A survey of botanical illustrations that ranges from beginnings in Greece and the Orient to their Western flowering during the Renaissance, through the famous 18th and 19th century artists, right up to modern times, with a look at the history and the famous practitioners of the art.

COMPARATIVE ENDOCRINOLOGY OF PROLACTIN — D. M. Ensor — Wiley, 1978, 309 p., illus., \$45. A review of prolactin physiology in lower vertebrates, mammals and humans.

THE COMPLETE OUTFITTING & SOURCE BOOK FOR BIRD WATCHING — Michael Scofield — Great Outdoors Trading Co (HR&W), 1978, 192 p., illus., paper, \$6.95. Covers history, equipment and accessories, publications, clubs and organizations, best U.S. birding sites, tours and expeditions, rare bird telephone numbers.

CONTRASTS IN BEHAVIOR: Adaptations in the Aquatic and Terrestrial Environments — Ernst S. Reese and Frederick J. Lighter — Wiley, 1978, 406 p., illus., \$27.50. Organized around four broad problem areas: reproduction behavior, communicative and regulatory behavior, feeding behavior and social behavior.

THE FUTURE SEA — George S. Fichter — Sterling, 1978, 168 p., color illus., \$12.95. Discusses current and future projects in ocean research that will tap earth's last frontier.

HEALTHWISE HANDBOOK — Toni M. Roberts et al — Doubleday, 1979, 250 p., illus., paper, \$6.95. This handbook is intended to help you become responsible for family health by learning when and how to treat minor illnesses at home and how to recognize when more skilled care is needed.

JUST LIKE AN ANIMAL — Maurice Burton — Scribner, 1978, 215 p., illus., \$12.50. A zoologist examines the amazing ways in which animals seem to show emotions and behavior, such as compassion, grief, unselfishness and affection.

LIFE: Origin and Evolution — Introduction by Clair Edwin Folsome — W H Freeman, 1979, 148 p., illus., \$9.95, paper, \$4.95. Articles and interpretations from SCIENTIFIC AMERICAN that focus on the origin of life on our planet; points of view range from astronomy to the evolution of proteins.

MY LIFE: Recollections of a Nobel Laureate — Max Born — Scribner, 1978, 308 p., illus., \$17.50. Written for his children and grandchildren and covering his life up to the beginning of World War II with occasional mentions of later periods. A postscript by his son is included to provide a general account of Born's later years. Originally published in German in 1975.

POPULATION EDUCATION: A Knowledge Base — Willard J. Jacobson — Tchrs Coll, 1979, 267 p., illus., \$12.95. Provides teachers a pattern for integrating concepts and data from the various disciplines relevant to an understanding of population issues.
