- May 20 (PBS)—"Rites of Spring" examines the controversy that surrounds eastern Canada's annual seal hunt, in which thousands of two- to three-week-old seal pups are killed for their downy fur (SN: 3/31/79, p. 202). On one side are environmentalists, such as the members of the Greenpeace Foundation, who feel that the seals' numbers are dwindling and that the method of slaughter is inhumane; on the other are those who maintain that their livelihood depends on the sale of seal pelts.
- May 21 (CBS) "The Body Human: The Sexes," the fourth special in the award-winning "Body Human" series, is an exploration of the mystery of human sexuality from prenatal infancy to old age, with emphasis on how the intricate system can break down. Featured are the stories of a woman with Fallopian tube blockage, a child who was born with the genetic imprint of a boy but the anatomy of a girl, a man undergoing microsurgery (SN: 4/7/79, p. 237) for the reversal of a vasectomy and a woman having a pituitary tumor removed by means of microsurgical techniques.
