**APOLLO: Ten Years Since Tranquillity Base** — Richard P. Hallion and Tom D. Crouch, Eds. — Smithsonian, 1979, 192 p., illus., \$17.50, paper, \$6.95. Essays that examine the political and social climate leading up to the moon landing, July 16, 1969, as well as the technological and scientific implications that resulted from it. Topics range from artists' views of the Apollo program to an in-depth look at the vehicles and equipment that made the mission possible.

**GEOLOGY ON THE MOON**—J. E. Guest and R. Greeley — Wykeham (Crane-Russak Co), 1977, 235 p., illus., \$17.95. Concerned with what has been learned within the last 15 years about the processes that have produced the present face of the moon. The principal processes are meteoric impact and volcanism. Many photographs enhance the text.

THE MOON BOOK—Bevan M. French—Penguin, 1977, 287 p., illus., paper, \$4.95. What we have learned from the Apollo program about our closest neighbor in space.

**NEW GUIDE TO THE MOON** — Patrick Moore—Norton, 1977, 320 p., 16 plates, drawings, \$10.95. A lively description of the moon, its geography, geology and movements, enriched by the recent discoveries. For readers who want to travel there by telescope, spaceship or imagination.
