ARCHOSAURIA: A New Look at the Old Dinosaur—John C. McLoughlin—Viking Pr. 1979, 117 p., illus. by the author, \$10.95. The author, a proponent of the new theories of advanced dinosaur metabolism, amasses data to support this point of view in readable language. Presents a strong for the dinosaur as one of the most successful animals ever to inhabit the earth

THE ARUN: A Natural History of the World's Deepest Valley—Edward W. Cronin Jr. -HM, 1979, 236 p., illus., \$10.95. Tells of the flora and the fauna, some quite unusual, in this Himalayan valley, and of the eight native tribes, each maintaining a separate language and culture, and of their ecological impact on the valley's environment.

THE BACKYARD BIRD WATCHER — George H. Harrison — S&S, 1979, 284 p., color and b&w illus., \$10.95. For those who enjoy watching birds in their own backyards. Tells how to make your garden most attractive to birds, how to build feeding stations and bird houses. Discusses problems that may arise in a successful bird habitat and the art of backyard bird photography.

CHICKEN SOUP: And Other Medical Matters — S. Harris, foreword by Willard R. Espy — W Kaufmann, 1979, 101 p., illus., \$7.95, paper, \$3.95. A cartoonist's delightful look at medicine and the medical profession.

THE CHILDHOOD EMOTIONAL PATTERN AND MATURITY — Leon J. Saul — Van Nos Reinhold, 1979, 479 p., \$18.95. Investigates the persistence of the childhood emotional pattern in later life. Identifies eight major aspects of emotional development of human beings and some of the characteristics of maturity to which each leads.

CULTURAL MATERIALISM: The Struggle for a Science of Culture — Marvin Harris — Random, 1979, 381, p., \$15. Cultural materialism is based on the premise that human social life is a response to the practical problem of earthly existence. The author, a distinguished anthropologist, wishes to show that this strategy leads to better scientific theories about the causes of sociocultural phenomena than do any of the rival strategies currently available.

THE MACROSCOPE: A New World Scientific System—Joël de Rosnay, translated from the French by Robert Edwards—Har-Row, 1979, 247 p., illus., \$15.95. The macroscope is a symbolic instrument made of a number of methods and techniques borrowed from very different disciplines with which the author looks at nature, society and man to try to identify new rules of education and action. Originally published in France in 1975.

NATURE'S COLORS: Dyes from Plants -Ida Grae — Collier Macmillan, 1979, 228 p., illus, paper, \$6.95. The ancient art of making dyes from plants is brought up to date. More than 200 recipes are given and instructions are provided for experimenting and working out your own recipes. Originally published in hardback in 1974.

PLANETS AND MOONS — William J. Kaufmann, III — W H Freeman, 1979, 219 p., illus., \$13, paper, \$7. Designed for the interested reader without a technical background in astronomy, this book is an expertly guided tour of our immediate astronomical neighborhood, the solar system. The text is enhanced by numerous photographs.

SECRETS OF THE ICE AGE: The World of the Cave Artists—Evan Hadingham—Walker & Co., 1979, 342 p., illus., \$14.95. An archaeologist provides an account for the general reader of life during the last Ice Age (75,000 B.C. to 9,000 B.C.), the time that marks the appearance of modern man and the earliest human art.

SOLAR SYSTEM — Peter Ryan, foreword by Carl Sagan — Viking Pr, 1979, 224 p., color illustrations by Ludek Pesek and photographs, \$19.95. The mysteries of our solar system are explored and explained. The text is enhanced with magnificent illustrations and diagrams.



More than 4,000 stars that can be viewed with the naked eye, field glasses or a small telescope are located and identified. 
