BEHAVIORAL BIOLOGY OF APLYSIA: A Contribution to the Comparative Study of Opisthobranch Molluscs—Eric R. Kandel—W H Freeman, 1979, 463 p., illus., \$40, paper, \$20. Brings together the extensive literature on *Aplysia*, which in recent years have been used as experimental animals. (See p. 219.)

JUVENILE DELINQUENCY AND ITS ORIGINS: An Integrated Theoretical Approach—Richard E. Johnson—Cambridge U Pr, 1979, 182 p., \$14.95, paper, \$4.95. Examines recent thought and research about the social and psychological causes of juvenile delinquency in Western society.

THE LEGENDARY DC-3—Carroll V. Glines and Wendell F. Moseley—Van Nos Reinhold, 1979, 224 p., illus., \$15.95, paper, \$8.95. One airplane has far surpassed all others in dependability and achievement. This book is about that airplane; its birth and development, its adoption by the airlines, its uses in three wars, its civilian use, its innumerable feats and its future.

MYSTERIES OF THE MUMMIES: The Story of the Unwrapping of a 2,000-year-old Mummy by a Team of Experts—Rosalie David, Ed.—Scribner, 1979, 192 p., color and b&w illus., \$14.95. The account of the postmortem examination of an Egyptian mummy—that of a young girl—that was done by the staff of Manchester University and televised by the BBC.

ROBERT MAILLART'S BRIDGES: The Art of Engineering—David P. Billington—Princeton U Pr, 1979, 146 p., illus., \$17.50. Shows how Maillart's bridges provide examples of structural form as a product of aesthetic feeling as well as technological integrity.

STATISTICS: Concepts and Controversies—David S. Moore—W H Freeman, 1979, 313 p., illus., \$15, paper, \$6.95. A book for the student and the general reader on statistical ideas and their relevance in public policy and in the human sciences from medicine to sociology.

SUICIDES—Jean Baechler, translated from the French by Barry Cooper—Basic, 1979, 474 p., \$21. This French sociologist has developed a comprehensive analysis of those most likely to commit suicide, under what circumstances and what methods they are likely to choose. An abridged translation of *Les Suicides* published in 1975.

TELEOLOGY REVISITED AND OTHER ESSAYS IN THE PHILOSOPHY AND HISTORY OF SCIENCE—Ernest Nagel—Columbia U Pr, 1979, 352 p., \$20. A collection of essays by an outstanding philosopher of science who believes that the logical methods of the modern natural sciences are the most effective instruments men have devised for acquiring reliable knowledge of the world.

UNDERSTANDING HUMAN ENGINEERING—John Hammond—David & Charles, 1979, 112 p., illus., \$12.95. The author has surveyed a wide field of study and attempted to interpret ergonomics in language for the general reader.
