**ASTRONOMY OF THE ANCIENTS**—Kenneth Brecher and Michael Feirtag, Eds—MIT Pr, 1979, 206 p., illus., \$12.50. These articles introduce the reader to the ancient astronomers—their observations, their instruments and their currently known explorations of the skies.

**CALCULATE!**—Sid Sackson—Pantheon, 1979, unpagged, illus., paper, \$2.95. Six games to play with a calculator that has at least an eight-digit display. Playing sheets are provided for these games, which are designed for two or more players.

**DISTURBING THE UNIVERSE**—Freeman Dyson—Har-Row, 1979, 283 p., \$12.95. This book inaugurates a major series sponsored by the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation and written by distinguished scientists from throughout the world, setting down their own accounts of their lives in science. In this fascinating autobiography Dyson, an outstanding physicist, mathematician and theoretical astronomer, conveys to the general reader both the excitement and dilemma of exploration and discovery in science.

**EARTHSHOCK**—Basil Booth and Frank Fitch—Walker & Co, 1979, 256 p., illus., \$14.95. Examines possible future natural disasters in the light of knowledge gained from earth science research. Points up the need for international cooperation to prevent unnecessary death and destruction from natural disasters.

**HO-PING: Food for Everyone**—Medard Gabel—Anchor Pr. Doubleday, 1979, 272 p., illus., paper, \$9.95. Investigates the problem of providing everyone on earth a nutritionally sound diet for the foreseeable future. Presents 42 major strategies for transforming the specter of food scarcity into the reality of global abundance.

**MEGALITHIC REMAINS IN BRITAIN AND BRITANNY**—A. Thom and A. S. Thom—Oxford U Pr, 1978, 192 p., illus., \$23.50. All the sites are analyzed geometrically and the units of measurement used by the builders are deduced and shown to be universal.

**MELLONI'S ILLUSTRATED MEDICAL DICTIONARY**—Ida Dox et al—Williams & Wilkins, 1979, 530 p., illus., \$16.50. A compilation of approximately 25,000 terms that comprise the common core of information for all the health sciences, along with a number of terms most frequently used in particular specialties. Designed for the general public interested in a brief explanation of medical terms and for students in the health sciences.

**MOMENTS OF VISION: The Stroboscopic Revolution in Photography**—Harold E. Edgerton and James R. Killian, Jr.—MIT Pr, 1979, 177 p., color and b&w illus., \$20. This book is about Edgerton and his remarkable achievements in stroboscopy and electronic flash photography. Contains nearly 200 photographs, including many of the pioneer and classic photographs as well as numerous recent photographs exemplifying his work in silhouette, night and underwater photography.

**PROJECTS AND DEMONSTRATIONS IN ASTRONOMY**—D. Tattersfield—Wiley, 1979, 331 p., illus., \$27.50. Practical work in astronomy that can be carried out indoors, independent of weather conditions and without the need of a telescope or binoculars. Taken together, the theory and the projects form a course in astronomy.

**THE STRUCTURE OF WORLD ENERGY DEMAND**—Robert S. Pindyck—MIT Pr, 1979, 299 p., chart & graphs, \$20. Concerned with differences in the characteristics of energy demands in both industrialized and less developed countries. Attention is focused in this study primarily on the energy use of the residential and industrial sectors.

**WORLD INDUSTRIAL ARCHAEOLOGY**—Kenneth Hudson—Cambridge U Pr, 1979, 247 p., illus., \$37.50, paper, \$9.95. Industrial archaeology is the discovery, recording and study of the physical remains of yesterday's industries and communications. Discusses techniques of this new area of study and the range of current work around the world.




