For people who wish to learn about the animals they may encounter from time to time in the countryside and, more and more frequently, in the suburbs. Beautiful color and b&w drawings by H. ECOLOGY OF SMALL MAMMALS—D. Michael Stoddart, Ed. Over half the known mammal species are small, weighing less than five kilograms. This book attempts to review the current knowledge in this field. Wiley, 1979, 386 p., illus., \$44.95.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT ANALYSIS HANDBOOK—John G. Rau and David C. Wooten, Eds. Provides the specific tools and techniques needed to evaluate, predict and prepare a complete environmental evaluation. McGraw, 1980, 656 p., illus., \$36.50.

FEVER: Its Biology, Evolution, and Function—Matthew J. Kluger. Traces the evolution of fever and investigates the adaptive value of fever. Princeton U Pr, 1979, 195 p., charts and graphs, \$15.

THE GESELL INSTITUTE'S CHILD FROM ONE TO SIX: Evaluating the Behavior of the Preschool Child—Louise Bates Ames et al. Describes for parents, teachers and psychologists those stages through which normal and measurable behaviors develop, emphasizing four fields of behavior: motor, adaptive, language and personal-social. Har-Row, 1979, 228 p., \$10.95.

KILL DEVIL HILL: Discovering the Secrets of the Wright Brothers—Harry Combs, foreword by Neil Armstrong. A veteran airman tells the story of the Wright brothers, who in four years built a machine that could fly while experimenters on both sides of the Atlantic tried and failed. HM, 1979, 389 p., illus., \$16.95.

LIFE IN SPACE—Dinah L. Moché. An update on life in space, from the origin and destiny of the planets to the possible existence of extraterrestrial beings. Includes the human and economic implications and technological feasibility of permanent communities in outer space. Color and b&w illustrations enhance the text. A&W Pubs, 1979, 159 p., illus., \$25, paper, \$10.95.

MARINE LIFE: An Illustrated Encyclopedia of Invertebrates in the Sea—J. David George and Jennifer J. George. A combination of text and magnificent color photographs of the living marine animals in their natural environment that enables readers to identify and classify marine invertebrates that they see both on shore and underwater. Wiley, 1979, 288 p., color and b&w illus., \$39.95.

McGRAW-HILL ENCYCLOPEDIA OF OCEAN AND ATMOSPHERIC SCIENCES—Sybil P. Parker, Ed. Coverage on all facets of the oceans and the atmosphere—chemical, physical, biological and geological—providing an integrated, interdisciplinary study of these two phases of the earth's system. McGraw, 1980, 580 p., illus., \$34.50.

THE NATURAL HISTORY OF THE MIND—Gordon Rattray Taylor. Examines in detail the intricate nature of subjective experience, in light of recent neuroscientific knowledge. Dutton, 1979, 370 p., illus., \$14.95.

RUNNING ON EMPTY: The Future of the Automobile in an Oil-Short World—Lester R. Brown et al. An initial assessment by staff members of the Worldwatch Institute of the fast-changing oil outlook and its implications for the future of the automobile. Norton, 1979, 116 p., charts and graphs, \$7.95.

THE TRANQUILIZING OF AMERICA: Pill Popping and the American Way of Life—Richard Hughes and Robert Brewin. Examines the abuse of tranquilizers and stimulants, especially in women, children and the elderly. Discusses over-the-counter drugs and the part drug companies and the FDA play in drug consumption. Lists the prescription drugs that the authors feel are most abused, along with their medical use and possible ill effects, and sources of help for those who are overdosing. THE VIOLENT FACE OF NATURE: Severe Phenomena and Natural Disasters—Kendrick Frazier. A fascinating book about the severe forces of nature and the disasters that result when human populations find themselves in the path of the unleashed destructive force.
