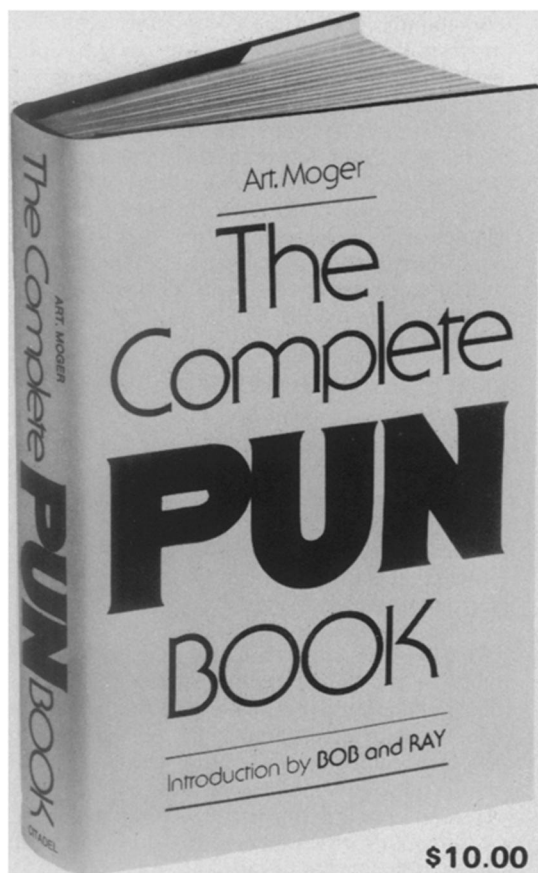

THE AUDUBON SOCIETY FIELD GUIDE TO NORTH AMERICAN REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS—John L. Behler and F. Wayne King. Covers all native and introduced reptiles and amphibians found in North America north of Mexico. Color photographs illustrate nearly every species in this range. Description, breeding, habitat, range, subspecies and additional notes are included for each species. Knopf, 1979, 719 p., color and b&w illus., \$9.95.

THE AUDUBON SOCIETY FIELD GUIDE TO NORTH AMERICAN WILDFLOWERS: Eastern Region—William A. Niering and Nancy C. Olmstead. The reader need not have access to a natural area to begin observing and identifying some of the more common wildflowers. A lawn, a city sidewalk or a vacant lot often provides a display of interesting species. Covers the area east of the Rockies and east of the Big Bend area of Texas to the Atlantic. Color photographs together with family and species descriptions make this a most useful field guide. Knopf, 1979, 863 p., color illus., \$9.95.

THE AUDUBON SOCIETY FIELD GUIDE TO NORTH AMERICAN WILDFLOWERS: Western Region—Richard Spellenberg. Beautiful color photographs, keyed by flower shapes to aid in identification, are followed by descriptions of families and species. Covers wildflowers found in the area from the eastern base of the Rocky Mountain west to the Pacific. Knopf, 1979, 862 p., color illus., \$9.95.

THE BIRDS OF PARADISE—Michael Everett. Describes and illustrates with beautiful color drawings 42 species of birds of paradise and 18 bowerbirds. Contains distribution maps and a description and photographs of the birds' habitat. Putnam, 1979, 144 p., color and b&w illus., \$22.50.

BLACK'S MEDICAL DICTIONARY—Revised by William A. R. Thomson. A new edition of this classic dictionary, which includes some 150 new entries. Other entries have been rewritten to bring up-to-date and new and proven drugs have been included. B&N, 32nd ed., 1979, 973 p., illus., \$22.95.

BUILDING AND USING A SOLAR-HEATED GEODESIC GREENHOUSE—John Fontanetta and Al Heller. Shows how anyone without special tools or equipment can build a geodesic greenhouse, maintain and operate it and raise food under the dome. Garden Way Pub, 1979, 193 p., illus., paper, \$8.95.

CHANCE, CAUSE, REASON: An Inquiry into the Nature of Scientific Evidence—Arthur W. Burks. Discusses philosophical problems concerning the nature of scientific evidence and related concepts, such as probability, causality and inductive reasoning, for those with some knowledge of mathematics and science. Originally published in hardback in 1977. U of Chicago Pr, 1979, 694 p., paper, \$12.50.

EXPLORING THE UNKNOWN: Great Mysteries Reexamined—Charles J. Cazeau and Stuart D. Scott, Jr. Explores some of the great mysteries of the earth that have captured popular imagination, particularly those with their roots in the authors' specialties of archaeology and geology. Examines the evidence that surrounds such mysteries as the legend of Atlantis, the ruins of Stonehenge, Easter Island and the Bermuda Triangle. Plenum Pr, 1979, 283 p., illus., \$15.95.

HOKULE'A: The Way to Tahiti — Ben R. Finney. The story of the reconstruction of a centuries'-old Polynesian double-hulled voyaging canoe and its 56-day, 6,000-mile voyage from Hawaii to Tahiti and back without benefit of modern equipment and instruments in order to give credence to the theory of the planned migrations of the Polynesian peoples to Hawaii. INFANTS — Robert B. McCall. How infants and children grow and change in the first three years and how parents can be an integral part of their baby's development. Harvard U Pr, 1979, 170 p., illus., \$10.

THE INVISIBLE FIRE: The Story of Mankind's Victory Over the Ancient Scourge of Smallpox — Joel N. Shurkin. Tells of something that has never been done before in all of human history — complete, total eradication of a killer disease. Putnam, 1979, 447 p., \$12.95.

MUSHROOMS AND TOADSTOOLS: A Field Guide — Geoffrey Kibby. The introduction acquaints the reader with the world of fungi from botanical, taxonomic and economic points of view. The field guide contains color illustrations and descriptions of more than 400 of the fungi of Britain and Europe. Oxford U Pr, 1979, 256 p., illus. by Sean Milne, \$23.

OF WOLVES AND MEN — Barry Holstun Lopez. Presents the wolf as an animal and as a product of the human imagination. Originally published in hardback in 1978. Scribner, 1979, 309 p., illus., paper, \$7.95.

PARENTS AND CHILDREN IN AUTISM — Marian K. DeMyer. The introduction indicates that while all parents experience severe stress in caring for an autistic child, some falter as individuals and marital partners and others appear to develop increased strength. This book examines the issues and points out those professional and parental practices that help and those that hinder parents in their task. Wiley, 1979, 277 p., charts & graphs, \$17.95.

PERSONAL COMPUTING: Home, Professional and Small Business Applications — Daniel R. McGlynn. A basic introduction to personal computers, their capabilities and limitations, an understanding of which is essential for evaluating and selecting personal computer equipment for professional, educational or recreational use. Wiley, 1979, 263 p., illus., paper, \$9.95.

PREHISTORIC HERITAGE — Felix R. Paturi, translated by Tania and Bernard Alexander. A tour of 26 of the most significant centers of prehistoric culture in Europe. Numerous photographs enhance the text. Scribner, 1979, 280 p., illus., \$14.95.

SOLAR ENERGY UTILIZATION — Tim Michels. Energy conservation in building design, which the author feels is more important than solar energy use, is discussed first. The very design of buildings places energy loads on society. Solar energy utilization is discussed in detail for the designer and the consumer as an alternative source of energy, with specific information about collectors, storage and sizing. SYNERGETICS 2: Explorations in the Geometry of Thinking — R. Buckminster Fuller with E. J. Applewhite. Continues, according to the introduction, the exposition of Fuller's radical geometrical cosmos with its landscapes of unfamiliar models and metaphors begun in *Synergetics I*. It amplifies and amends, but does not supersede, the earlier volume published in 1975. This volume makes more explicit the significance of certain geometrical functions that are only implicit in the previous work. Macmillan, 1979, 592 p., illus., \$27.50.
